
The services depend entirely on volunteers. Therefore, it is not possible for us to guarantee that a volunteer will be available. We will do our best to find a volunteer to help you.

Enhancing Regional Community Capacity Updates

The satellite office in Shannon opened its doors again on June 10th, and is open during the summer on Wednesdays and Thursdays during regular office hours.

This past spring, several initiatives and projects with local partners, schools and members of the English-speaking community in the Northern perimeter of Québec City were unfortunately put on hold due to circumstances surrounding the Covid-19 crisis.

The intergenerational reading activity *Story Time with Seniors*, for example, in partnership with Dollard-des-Ormeaux (DDO) School and local seniors, was due to start on March 26th in a 4th grade classroom. Despite school closures, a 1st virtual online story time reading was realized nonetheless thanks to dedicated locals and a coordinated "virtual" effort! VEQ hopes this activity can be kick-started again during the 2020-2021 school year.

VEQ also partnered with DDO School to contribute for the makings of a very special and colorful graduation. On June 19th, DDO high school grads were surprised to see their diplomas hand-delivered to their homes via lively staff, decorated cars and fun posters!

The satellite office will continue implementing current VEQ services in 2020-2021, including community outreach and development, Newcomers' services, and acting as a hub of information for the English-speaking community. VEQ will continue strengthening existing partnerships and seek to develop new ones in municipalities such as Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier, Shannon, Stoneham-et-Tewkesbury and Portneuf.

Youth Employability Project Updates

While the pandemic has been a challenging time, it has also opened up possibilities to be more creative and experimental in how our services and activities are delivered. Since we no longer could host the events we had planned for the high schools, we transitioned to doing similar activities virtually with good results.
