- LEARN offers free tutoring for grade 2 to 12 English language students in Québec
- 200 certified teachers offering up to 45,000 sessions this year, triple the number in previous years

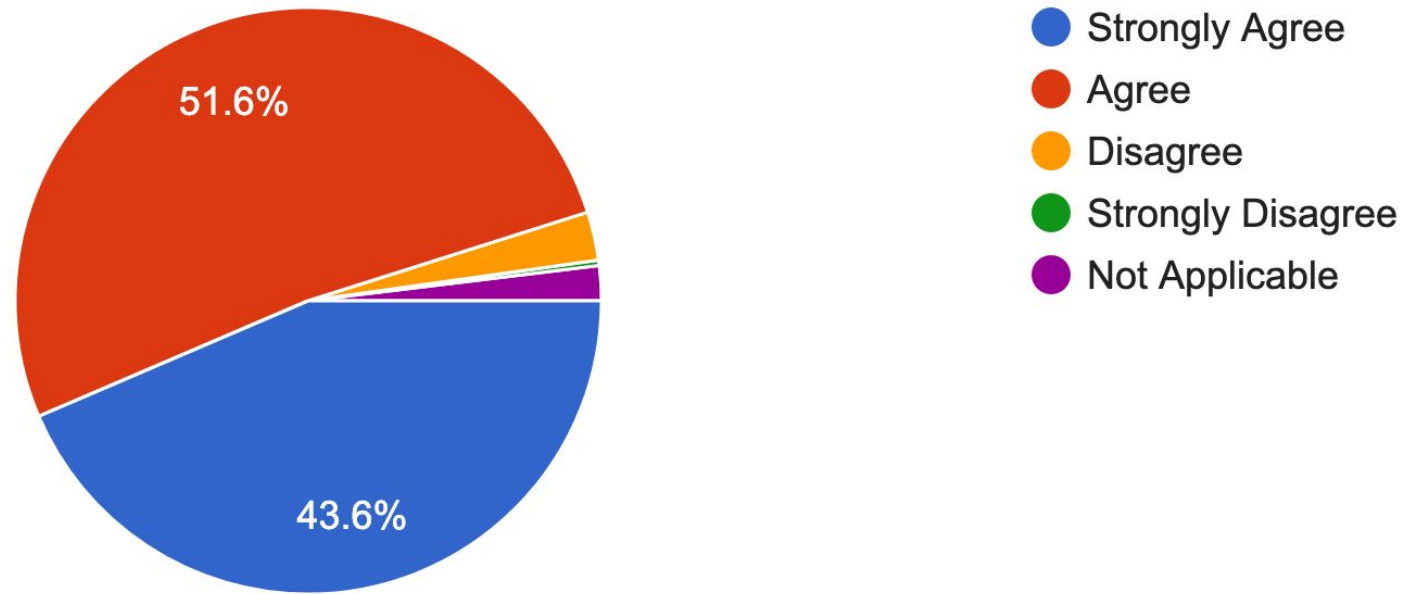


- Canadian eLearning Network commissioned to survey parents in January 2023 on program effectiveness
- 10-question survey with 700 responses from 2900 parents surveyed (24% return rate)

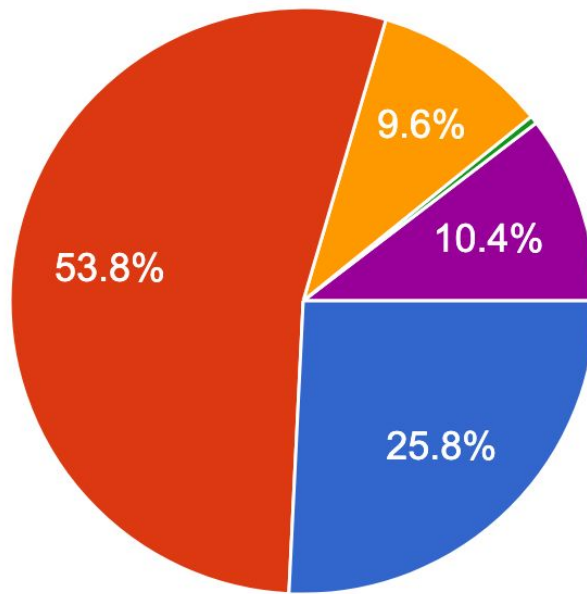

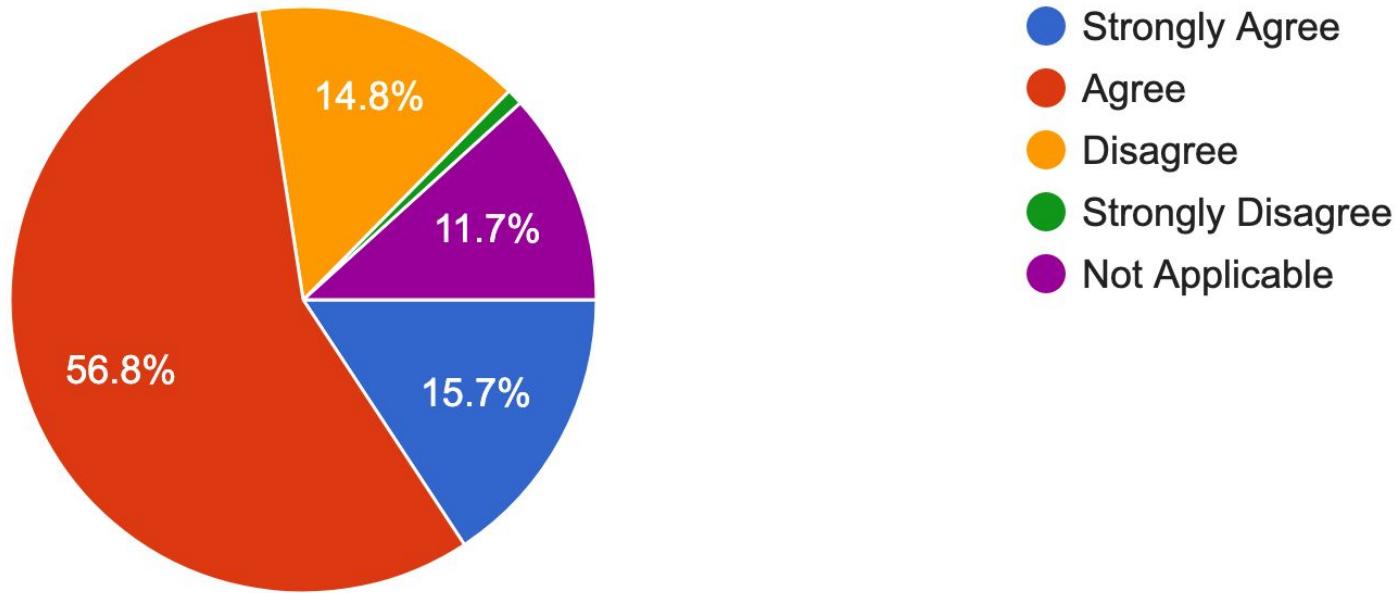

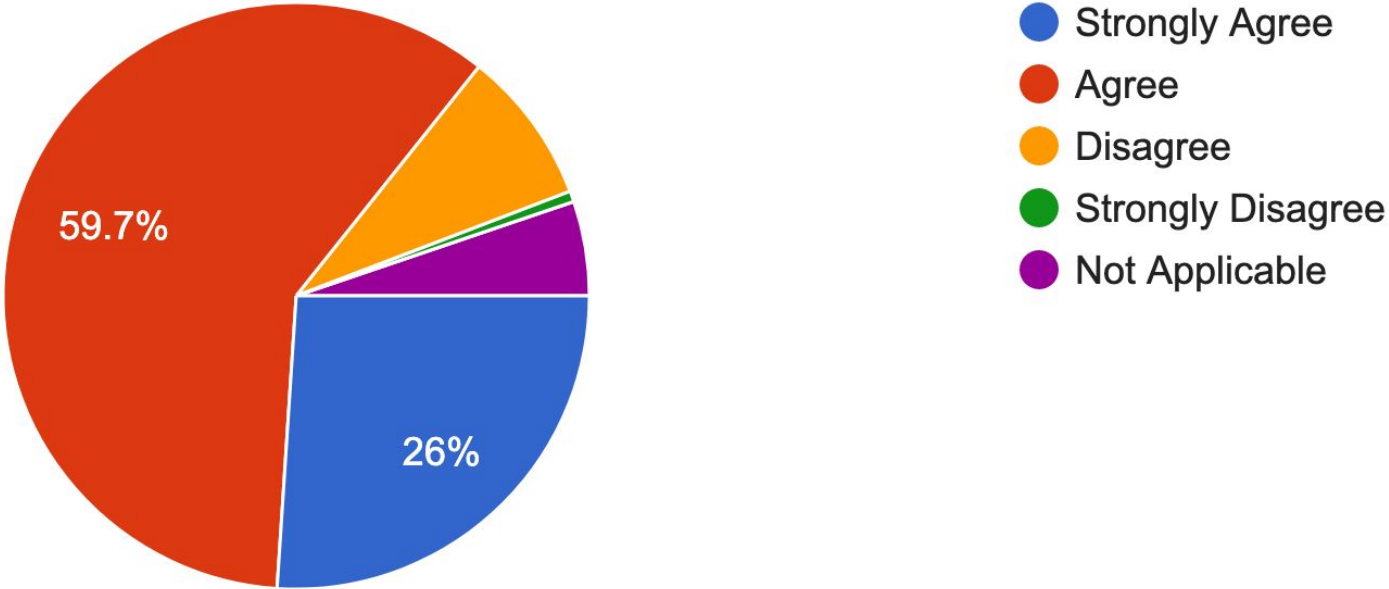

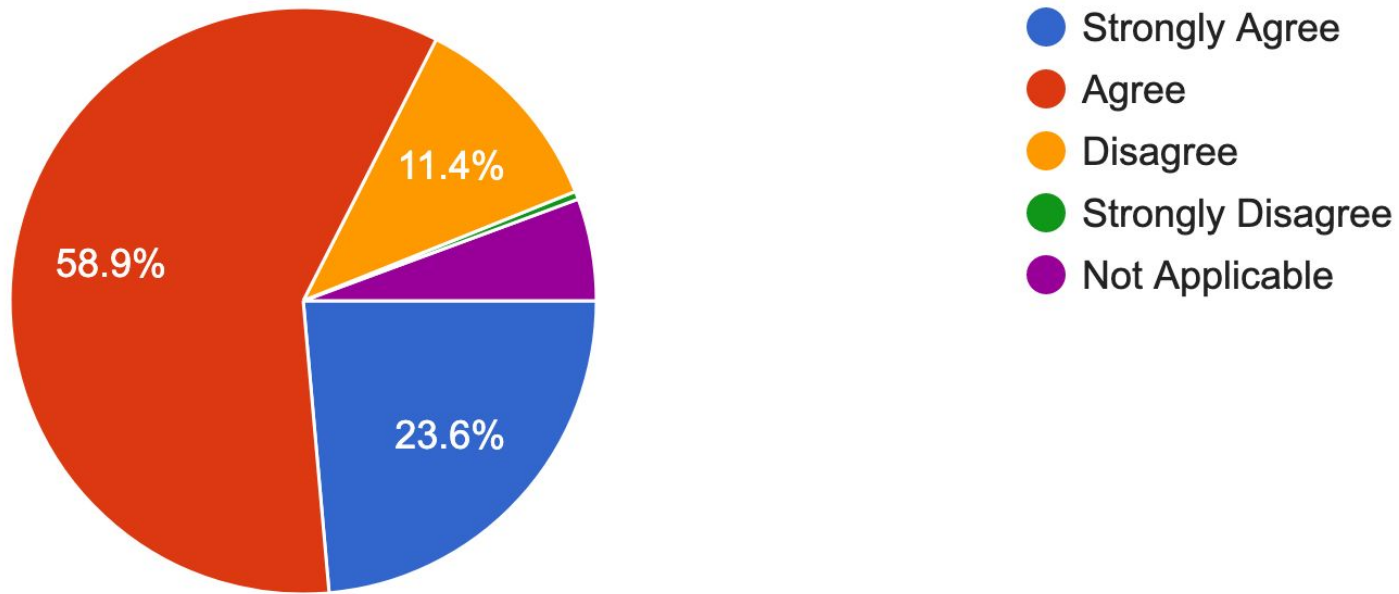

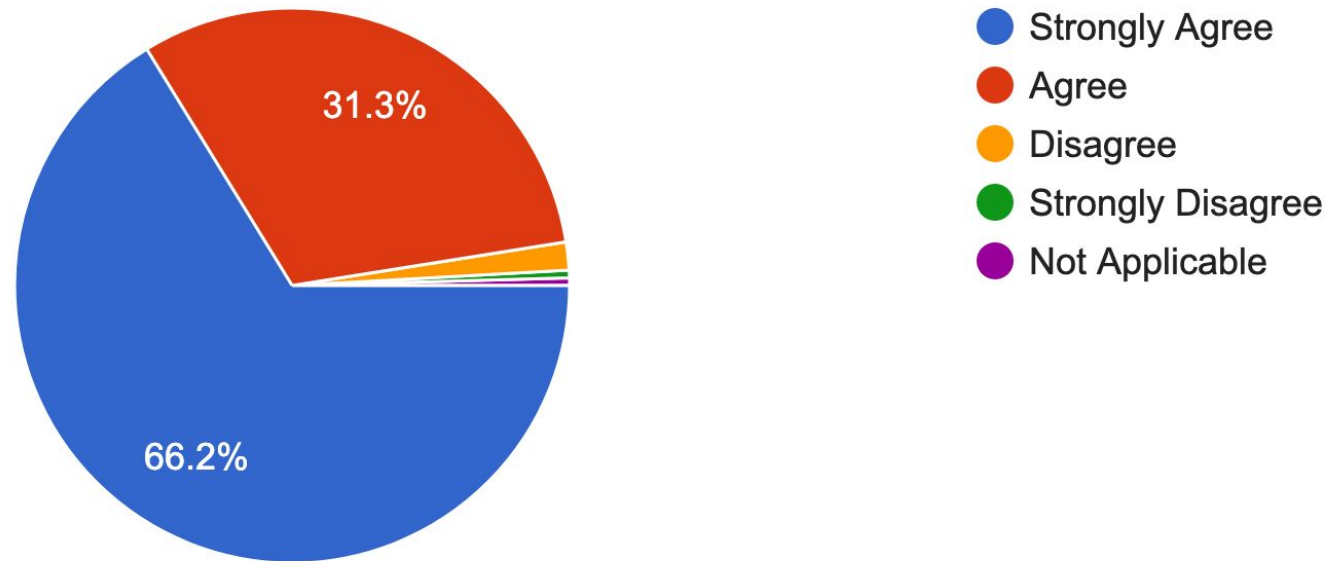

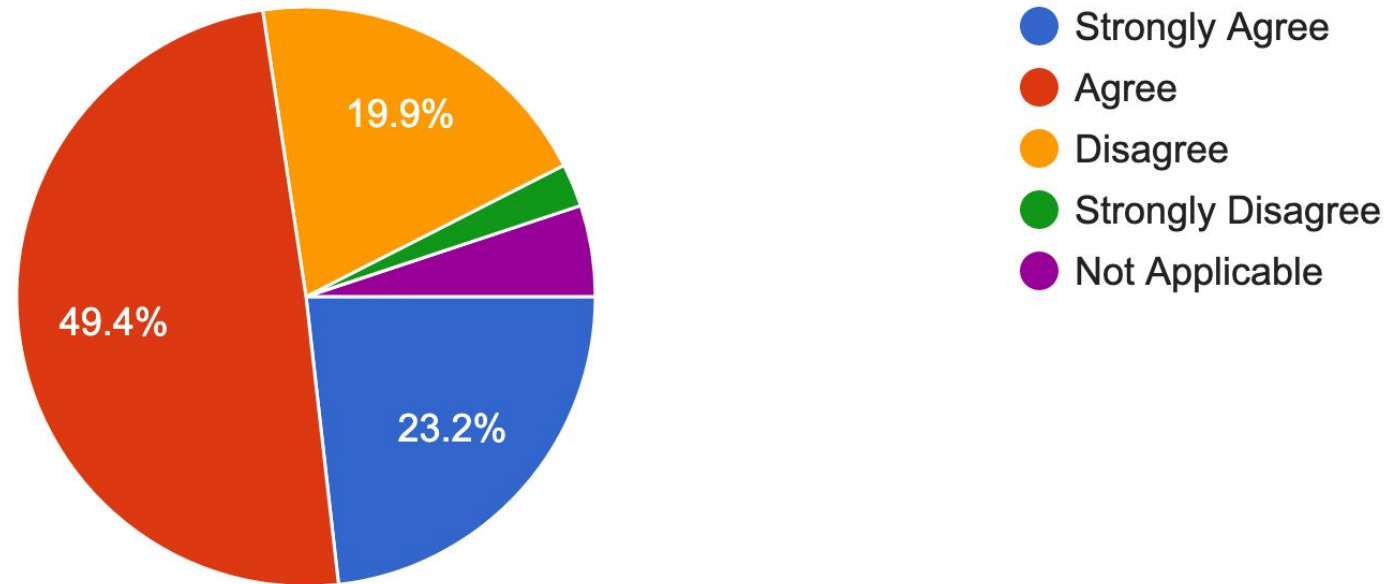
