## FEATURE: WINSTON (PICKS) RICHARDS IS BACK AT THE ASSOCIATION!



Winston Richards Chef, Cool Runnings

Winston Richards is a proud native of Savanna La Mar, Westmoreland, Jamaica. He grew up with his beloved Grandmother Mrs. Alberta "Ms. Berta" Samuels who taught him all she knew about housework. He confirms that he took to doing very well. In 1974, he left Savanna La Mar and went to Toronto to join one of his aunts. What was surprising to him was that many people in Toronto knew him, even though he had just arrived, as so many were from his hometown in Jamaica.

He spent 3 months in Ontario before moving to Quebec to join 3 other aunts who lived in Montreal. He found the latter city to be a better place for it was more hospitable. After a very short while, he started working at Eikens in 1975 and stayed there for 2 years.

In the early 70's that was the place for West Indian people to go and get produce from home. Those who do not know, Eikens was located on St. Laurent between Dorchester and St. Catherine.

In the early 80's, he studied to become a machinist at a school in Lachine. After his studies, he looked to apprentice in the field and found that opportunity in the East of Montreal. However, that only lasted 2 months due to work shortages. In 1982, he was the first Black man hired at UPS in Montreal. Being an industrious person, he looked for other work opportunities but there was no other so he decided that he would do something he knew, something his grandmother taught him which was cooking. He began his new venture in an apartment on Chester and Randall streets while working at UPS. In fact, at the time, the new owner of the building noted that Mr. Richards was doing a steady restaurant business out of his apartment and offered to start a restaurant with him; however, Mr. Richards refused.

By 1996, he decided to leave UPS, as he was not given the opportunity for a leave of absence to pursue what was a lucrative cooking business. This big change in his life is what started the restaurant named "Picks" on de Maisonneuve just across from Vendome metro station. However, by 2004, he left that space and opened another restaurant also known as "Picks" in Cote St. Luc between 2006 and 2010. After leaving that, it was then Mr. Richards, opened his kitchen at the Jamaica Association and was here for approximately 3 years. He states "that it was a wild ride"

After leaving the Association, he joined "Ma's Place" that was located on Sherbrooke Street for a couple of years. Shortly after this, he went to Florida to help his brother who also owns a restaurant in Tampa Bay. In fact, one can say that cooking in the family blood line as his brother in Florida and another in Jamaica both own restaurants. After leaving Tampa, he returned to Montreal. Over several years, Picks took time to crisscross the Atlantic and the Caribbean Sea paying homage to his dearly departed Mother in one instance. However, by 2019 he was back in Montreal. In early 2022, Mark Henry, President, reached out to Mr. Richards and asked him to give the Association another try, to which he accepted to our absolute delight.

In doing so, the restaurant was renamed to **Cool Runnings** to highlight new beginnings and a few fresh start! However, the reader may still be wondering, why do people call Mr. Richards "Picks". Well, before that he was known as Saco; however, Mickey Gillespies' Dad renamed him Picks and that name stuck. The reason: he always had a toothpick in his mouth!!

Welcome back Mr. Richards, we are happy to have you join the Jamaica Association of Montreal team.

Cool Runnings Restaurant reopened on April 9 with a soft launch – the Grand Opening is Saturday, May 28 from 4 pm to 8 pm. Regular hours: Tues. – Wed. (12 pm – 7 pm) \* Thurs. (12 pm – 5 pm) \* Fri.
