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## A WORD FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It was an outstanding 2016-2017 year for the 4 Korners Family Resource Center. We delivered over 75 activities across the Laurentians, increasing our reach to remote and isolated communities. These activities covered health, social service, safety and legal topics. Staff, volunteers, community leaders, and partners played a vital role in supporting this year's initiatives by delivering information and resources for the English-Speaking Community. Thank you.

Our innumerable successes are highlighted by some of this year's special projects which include the Health Caravan. Touring the Laurentian communities, the Caravan visited three high schools this year, reaching over 500 youth in the region. High school students not only received some healthy advice themselves but also got to learn about valuable and meaningful career options in the health, justice and social services sectors. The Health Passport was circulated, and distributed to different points of services in the CISSS des Laurentides as a communication tool; it assisted in effectuating communication between "users" of services, as well as professionals. Furthermore, a team member was trained in the "Prevention of the Mistreatment of Seniors;" this team member has since commenced training within the community. These are but some of the accomplishments 4 Korners has achieved for the 2016-2017 year.

We appreciate the recognition to fulfill the need for English-speaking communities to have access to tools, resources, and vital pieces of information; this has been achieved through ongoing funding and special initiatives. The continuous reach to communities would not have been obtained without the contribution of our funders.

Since 2014 I have had the opportunity to meet new people, build relationships, and collaborate on projects with the purpose of carrying out the 4 Korners mission. This opportunity has allowed me to develop a greater understanding of the Laurentians. Each community is unique, with its own needs, strengths, and resources.

#### **Values**

#### **PROGRAMS AND SERVICES**

#### **INFORMATION and RESOURCES**

The main role of the staff at the 4 Korners Family Resource Center is to provide information and guidance in navigating health and social services in the Laurentians in English.

Health information is provided through distribution of printed materials and reference to the 4 Korners online database. Referrals are also made to health and social service establishments or fellow community organizations which are able to provide services in English.

4 Korners Family Resource Center holds Information sessions, programs and activities regularly for the public that contribute to health and well-being.

Members can access these services by phone, email or in-person at one of the three office locations in the Laurentians.

In 2016-2017 there were over 1850 emails, phone calls and walk-ins by individuals inquiring about services in the Laurentians.





# BREAKING ISOLATION - number of interventions at a glance

The charts give an overview on the number of activities/actions made possible through the various programs, projects and activities offered by 4 Korners in 2016-2017.

More than 11 000 people were reached through our activities.

Many of these numbers represent people who use our services time and again and have come to rely on us.

29% of intakes represent over 1850 incoming requests and referrals. Each intake is directly followed-up by one of the 4 Korners' team member.

In 2016-2017, 82 members renewed their membership.

#### **NETWORKING IN THE LAURENTIANS**

4 Korners Family Resource Center, through a grant from the CHSSN (Community Health and Social Services Network) and Health Canada, sponsors a network called the Laurentian English Services Advisory Network (LESAN).

LESAN is a network of English-speaking people and their organizations and associations that has as its mission to improve access to services and, in particular, health and social services in their language. It enables the English-speaking community to establish common goals and to be in a position to speak with one voice to promote improved services in English.

LESAN members are primarily volunteers and representatives of local and regional community organizations and institutions. Members of the LESAN committees sit at various round tables throughout the region to communicate the needs of the English-speaking population and to bring information to the English-speaking community.

In 2015, a Communication Committee was formed. This allowed for an improved flow of information, support and solidarity between the LESAN working groups. The Committee's communication kit is available on the 4 Korners website to reach individuals, organizations and institutions.

## **Health, Justice and Social Services Caravan**

The mission of 4 Korners is to improve access to services in English throughout the Laurentians. Though there are currently only three physical locations, there are events held in many towns or municipalities.

The Health, Justice and Social Services Caravan in collaboration with John Abbott College took services to 5 towns in 4 MRCs in 2016-2017. Over 500 high school students were exposed to possible career paths in the sectors represented. The students also gained knowledge interacting with the John Abbott students.

The communities were also welcome to drop in and have various basic health tests, some of which are not regularly given at a general check-up.





#### REACHING THE COMMUNITIES OF THE LAURENTIANS

As a regional organization, our mission is to reach all communities of the Laurentians to ensure improved access to health and social services, information and activities in English. Although there are currently only 3 offices in the region, inquiries come from all parts of the Laurentians and partnerships and activities occur in many different communities in the 5 MRC. Deux-Montagnes, Thérèse-de-Blainville, Argenteuil, Pays-d'en-Haut and des Laurentides.



Monthly newsletter that began in September 2015 has grown from 414 to 468 subscribers in 2016-2017.



Playing cards that have health and social service resource information were designed, printed and began being distributed in March 2017. 150 decks disseminated to date.




Resource directory booklets are available at all our offices, kiosks and information sessions. The resources are also listed on our website. Over 500 directories were distributed in 2016-2017.
