Expanding Horizons

Project for special needs and at-risk youth

The Expanding Horizons (EH) project, the two-year initiative which started in spring 2017 is concluding its final phase come March 31st 2019. EH stems from a need in the community to address the needs of special needs and at-risk youth of the Greater Quebéc City region, between the ages of 16 and 29 years old.

Funded by the Government of Canada via the Community Innovation Fund, EH was one of 10 projects chosen throughout the Province of Quebec to provide direct support to this vulnerable segment of our community, by creating work-plateaus and employment opportunities.

Through community, private and public partnerships, EH aimed to help youth develop and improve their employability skills, autonomy and confidence, while breaking social isolation and earning wages.

We are happy to share that in its 1st year (April 2017-March 2018), 10 work-plateaus were created for 5 special needs and at-risk youth. The 2nd year (April 2018-March 2019) continued to develop a network of partners and beneficiaries, enabling 19 on-the-job training opportunities for 10 young adults from our region.

The "Book Fair" work plateau is a successful example of how EH, through a partnership with SNACS Entrepreneurs enabled 4 young adults to work and help manage this year's Book Fair. In its 2nd year, new partnerships were also created with Cegep Champlain - St. Lawrence, Mount Hermon Cemetery, private businesses such as Centre mosaïque de Québec and Boule Miche, a local bakery, helping to create several additional work-plateaus and full-time job opportunities.

To conclude, it has been enriching and inspiring to see how creative partnerships can fill a need for both special needs and at-risk youth and employers of the Greater Quebec city region. It is encouraging to know that some of these employment opportunities will be sustained after the end of the project which is also one of the objectives of Expanding Horizons. A step in the right direction, showing the constructive roles both these actors can play in our community and in today's job market.

Thanks to all the participants, the partners and the special needs and at-risk youth from our community who made this project a success!




