SENIORS ACTION QUEBEC - STILL ON THE MOVE

If we thought that 2023 started with a bang, it hasn't stopped and has picked up even more! We had barely recovered from all the activities in March (including our financial year-end) when the post-Easter break saw us preparing a retreat for our Board of Directors – a two-day meeting held on 21 and 22 April, predominantly involving face-to-face meetings, a first after the pandemic; plus commencing work on the Annual Report and Annual General Meeting held on June 6, via ZOOM.

However, if we thought May would be quieter, how wrong we were! In April we had received an invitation from the Secrétariat des Aînés to present a brief on aging as part of their 2024–2029 Action Plan, which was duly submitted. Then we received an invitation to attend a one-day forum on May 18 in Quebec to present the brief along with other organizations (present in the room and on-line) where we were the sole English-speaking organization. Various community organization conferences and AGMs have also been held in the last two months. Perhaps the most memorable was the conference organized by the <u>Regional Development Network</u> (RDN) and the <u>Provincial Employment Roundtable</u> (PERT), comprising different English-speaking organizations throughout the province, working collectively to address the employment challenges of the English-speaking community and to explore solutions to move Quebec's economy forward. This conference highlighted many other issues facing our community, particularly in the regions, and filled in more of the picture we are painting for ourselves of the Quebec English-speaking community in all its nuances.
