SENIORS ACTION QUEBEC ON THE MOVE

2023 started with a bang!

At the beginning of January, Seniors Action Quebec, along with other provincially mandated organizations, was invited to meet Éric Girard, the Finance Minister and new head of the Secrétarait aux Relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise. The meeting proved to be extremely fruitful. Various organizations were able to introduce themselves to Minister Girard who asked questions about challenges facing organizations working in specific sectors in the English-speaking community. Seniors Action Quebec was able to highlight challenges being faced by seniors in Quebec and the unique challenges being faced by English-speaking seniors, caregivers and organizations working with these two populations. President Walter Duszara also spoke on the future goals of the organization and how we are planning to increase our policy and research capacity as an organization. We very much look forward to future meetings and conversations with the Minister and with representatives from the Secrétariat aux Relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise.

After the meeting, Seniors Action Quebec was invited to attend day one of the Community Health and Social Services Network Building Exchange 2023 Exchange Conference. This was the first in-person conference since the pandemic. It focused on health services and adaptive services in the English-speaking community. There were some very inspiring and interesting presentations that were given and Seniors Action Quebec was happy to finally be able to meet many organizations from different regions of the province, who are involved in CHSSN's NPI program. It was lovely to finally meet people in-person after nearly 3 years of ZOOM! Seniors Action Quebec very much looks forward to working with these organizations in the future. In March, Seniors Action Quebec was once again on the move.

On Friday, March 3 2023, CHSSN invited us to attend a full-day event highlighting the work being done by organizations who received funding from the Supporting and Promoting Mental Health in OLMCs in Quebec 2022-2024 project. Many of the presentations revolved around services, created and run by community organizations and groups, that addressed general mental health and related issues that had arisen from the COVID-19 pandemic. It was heartwarming and inspiring to see the tremendous amount of work being done by these groups and a reminder of the toll the pandemic has had on various populations – both young and old.

The following week on March 10, we attended a one-day event organized by the <u>Quebec Community Groups Network</u> (QCGN) on the Community Vitality Plan - an action plan highlighting the set of priorities that were identified by the English-speaking community. Four roundtables, made up of representatives of various English-speaking organizations, have been meeting regularly since 2021 to discuss four areas of priority for the English-speaking community: Data, Organization Health, Representation and Funding. SAQ is a member of the Funding table. It was an informative day and we will share more information as it becomes available.

This project examines the concept of belonging in the minority English-speaking community of Quebec. Our project is one of five that make up the <u>COM-Unity project</u>.

For the third and final phase of the project, Seniors Action Quebec produced a short documentary bookending the first- and second-year videos.

The documentary wove the interviews from the first-year project with English-speaking seniors with the footage for the second-year project that focused on English-speaking organizations working directly with seniors, to investigate and determine what belonging means to English-speaking seniors throughout the province.
