Services for the English-Speaking Community of Montréalégie Ouest


Whether in the field of health, social services or community services, the Montréalégie West Community Network (MWCN) offers a wide range of activities for all ages from early childhood to seniors for the entire English-speaking community in the region, whether in Châteauguay for the Roussillon region or in the Châteauguay Valley for the Beauharnois-Salaberry, Haut-Saint-Laurent and Jardins-de-Napierville regions, as well as in the Vaudreuil-Soulanges region. Three satellite offices are located in Châteauguay, Huntingdon and Pincourt to better serve the community.

For 21 years now, Pauline Wiedow has been setting up this organization, first with a few friends in Châteauguay, then later in the Montréalégie Ouest region and for the past two and a half years in Vaudreuil-Soulanges. Pauline Wiedow's vision, generosity and determination have never ceased to attract and mobilize friends, collaborators, volunteers and now a dozen employees who all work in unison to offer services to a population happy to meet and be together in English. In fact, there are 88,000 English-speaking citizens in the Montréalégie West, including 46,000 in the Vaudreuil-Soulanges MRC alone, or nearly one citizen in three. Numerous partnerships have been established with the Centre intégré de santé et de services sociaux de la Montréalégie Ouest (CISSMO) and the Community Health and Social Services Network (CHSSN), including McGill University, Heritage Canada, the Secrétariat aux relations avec les québécois d'expression anglaise, Éducaloi and the Fondation Lucie et André Chagnon, to name but a few.

This summer four students are employed by the MWCN throughout the territory and every year scholarships from McGill University are sent through the MWCN. Let's note the organization of the Vaudreuil-Soulanges YOUTH GALA that, in May 2019, brought together 430 people to celebrate 56 graduating elementary and secondary students from the territory's schools. It is thanks to partnerships with Desjardins Vaudreuil-Soulanges, the City of Île Perrot and the Lester B. Pearson School Board that this initiative has taken place and will return year after year. Presence, dynamism, active listening, openness, everything is put in place by Pauline Wiedow and the many collaborators she inspires to enable the English-speaking community of Montréalégie Ouest to flourish and blossom. 'SAVVY SENIORS' A SPOTLIGHT ON MARGARET SIMONS

KEEP SETTING GOALS!

When I first met Margaret Simons, I had no idea that she would be such an inspiration. Within the first hour of meeting her she had intrigued me with her wit and ingenious personality. However, this intriguing woman, to no surprise, also had a jampacked schedule which made having a sit

down with her a little more difficult but worth the wait.

Margaret was born and raised in Quebec City with her sister and two brothers. As a teenager she was sick for almost 10 years, going through multiple tests with no diagnosis which unfortunately put her behind in school. However, at 19 years old she moved to Montreal and into a studio apartment where she lived while finishing her education at Centennial Academy. Over the years Margaret worked hard to create a self-sufficient life for herself. She says that being sick as a child, while it did affect her self-confidence it also gave her the drive to be constantly proving to herself and to others that she was capable and independent. So, with that drive she started setting goals for herself.

One of these goals was to own a house before she was 40 and at 37 years old that is exactly what she did. With that goal checked off her list Margaret signed up for university, at the age of 45. Working days and going to school at night for 3 years, as well as taking intensive courses during her summer vacation, she slowly chipped away at her degree.

Which brings me to her next goal to graduate before turning 50. Still determined as ever, she was able to go to school full time the last 2 years where just two days before her 50th birthday she received official recognition of her degree in Therapeutic Recreation from Concordia University.

Now retired, she continues to work with the Alzheimer's society as well as volunteering whenever she can and continues to set goals for herself. This time around she would like to have her current home paid off by the time she is 70. Coming to the end of our conversation Margaret encouraged the importance of finding a job that you love and to never stop doing your research. Even today she is always reading and searching for answers to any and all questions that come her way.

For myself, as a young adult some days I feel like maybe I'm not on the right track or that I am behind, but the truth is we are always right where we need to be and we just have to keep setting goals for ourselves and then just don't stop.

Thank you for teaching me that Margaret!
