01. CENTRE DE SERVICES SCOLAIRES DU LITTORAL



Immigration is an important element to consider in addressing the labour shortages that limit development efforts, and it is a topic that has been discussed at various meetings in the region over the years. The Centre de services scolaire du Littoral was pleased to welcome and have a brief discussion with Ms. Marilène Gill, Member of Parliament for Manicouagan, and Mr. Yves-François Blanchet, leader of the Bloc Québécois, on the subject of immigration and the francization program for immigrants, which is part of the General Adult Education. Ms. Kimberly Buffitt, who joined the meeting on behalf of the Coasters Association, noted some of the challenges encountered by businesses

and immigrants. A dynamic francization program for immigrants, and access to a Test d'Évaluation de Français (TEF) testing center in the most eastern MRC of Quebec are essential to supporting the integration of immigrants in our unique part of Quebec society.

02. COASTERS ASSOCIATION UPDATES

PHASE 2 - ERCC PROGRAM

The Secrétariat aux Relations avec Québécois d'Expression Anglaise (SRQEA) has continued the Enhancing Regional Community Capacity (ERCC) program with Phase 2 – Strengthen Community Vitality. Phase 2 of the ERCC focuses on four (4) objectives; improve organizational capacity, increase regional coverage of organizations serving English-speaking Quebecers, expand mandate to key sectors of activity and to increase interactions with local and regional government entities and francophone stakeholders.

Since April 2021, there have been important actions taken to increase the Lower North Shore's interactions with regional government entities and francophone stakeholders. In May, the Coasters Association had the opportunity to present to the members of the Conférence administrative régionale (CAR), thanks to the support of the regional direction of the Ministère des Affaires municipales et de l'Habitation (MAMH). The Coasters Association was able to present the statistics, issues and priorities of the communities that were identified during the 2020 Coastal Summit.

03. NORTHERN RESEARCH CENTER UPDATES

HOUSING ASSESSMENT IN TÊTE-À-LA-BALEINE



In the fall of 2020, the Coasters Association held a Coastal Summit and as a result an action committee was established consisting of members from Coasters Association, CSSL, MRCGSL, Municipality de la Côte Nord du Golfe St. Laurent and the Local Committee of Tête-à-la-Baleine. After discussions were held, it was recognized that the housing situation in the community of Tête-à-la-Baleine had needs and challenges.

Subsequently an advisory committee was formed, and a housing assessment is being carried out. With funding provided under the Quebec Social Initiatives Fund (FQIS), and a financial commitment from the MRC, the Coasters Association has been contracted to complete the study and Paige Buffitt has been hired to carry out the assessment and reporting. Paige will be supported by the Director of the Northern Research Center, Katie Roberts, and they will be working collaboratively with the

local advisory committee and the Municipality. Surveys are presently being carried out to assess the housing situation in Tête-à-la-Baleine so please stay tuned. **Congratulations Paige on your position!**

05. KIDS SUMMER CAMP

15 YEARS AND STILL IN OPERATION

The summer camp entitled **Kindness, Inspiration, Determination, Spirit**, "KIDS", has proven to be a great success. In 2007, the Coasters Association expanded the KIDS Summer Camp to two (2) additional communities (La Tabatiere, and Blanc Sablon). In 2019, the Municipality of Blanc Sablon operated the camp in Blanc Sablon, and the Coasters Association delivered the camps in St. Paul's River and La Tabatière.



The mission of the KIDS Summer Camp is to nurture and develop a safe and healthy environment. The Camp not only fulfills its mission but provides employment opportunities for our students who are furthering their education and assists the working families. It is a social, educational, environmental, cultural, community and historical development activity. It is also known that kids who are involved in summer activities (such as the camp) do better in the up-coming school year and participate more in community events.

At the start-up of the KIDS summer camp in 2006, Kimberly and I never envisioned having her daughter (Shae-Lynn Roberts), and my granddaughters (Ashley Roberts, Latesha Fequet) work at the camp, but they did, and this experience laid the foundation for future employment with the Coasters Association, and with support from partnering organizations, such as Cedfob, Steel River Group and I&S Seafood.
