


What's New at Y4Y?




Wednesday, June 22nd from 6-7:30 pm


Survey Alert!

Mental Health in the Anthropocene: Climate Anxiety among Québec's English-Speaking Youth

Climate change does not merely threaten our physical environments—it also threatens our mental health. As climate conditions worsen, so do feelings of climate-related anxiety, which can lead to a host of psychosocial responses such as depression and post-traumatic stress.

Y4Y's new policy brief, co-written by Alex Pettem and Fernanda Rengel, explores the potential surge in demand for climate-conscious mental health care in the minority language, and how organisations might support English-speaking youth in receiving it.


New Blog Posts!
