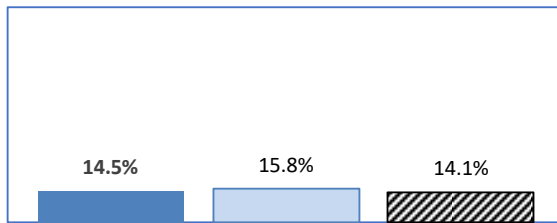

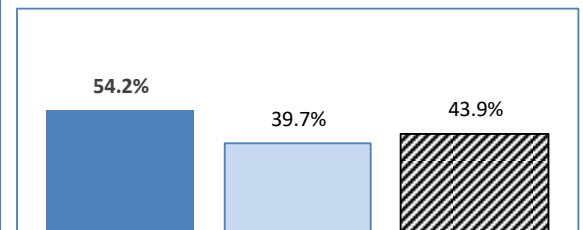

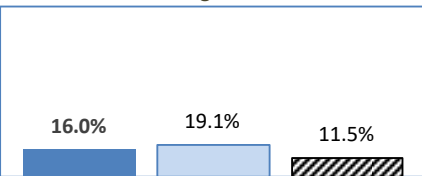

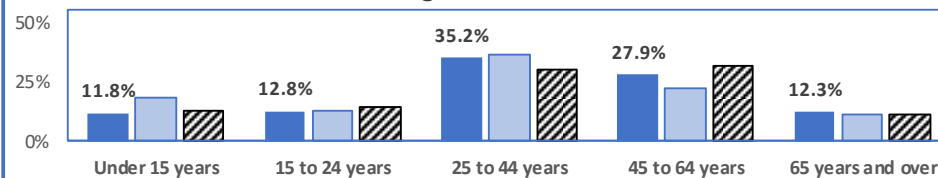

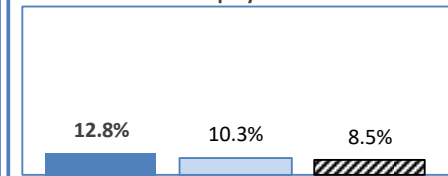
Living Alone



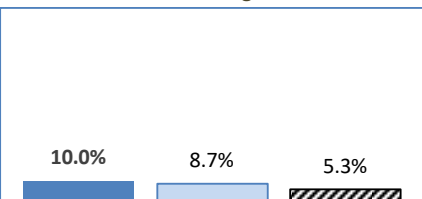
Age Structure



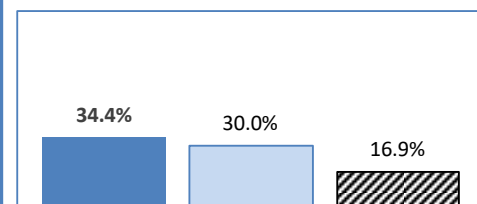

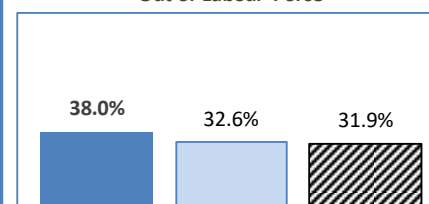

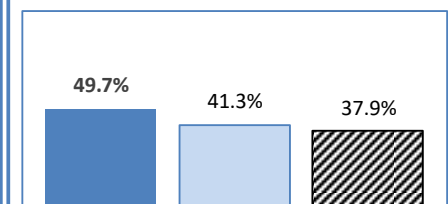

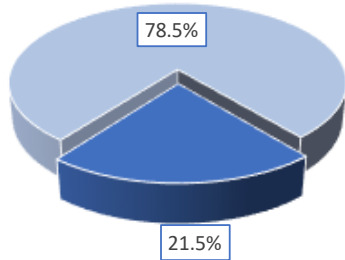

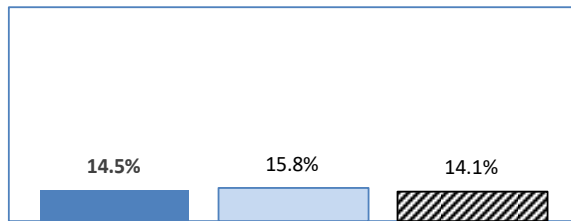

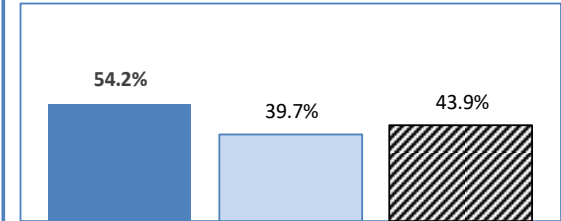

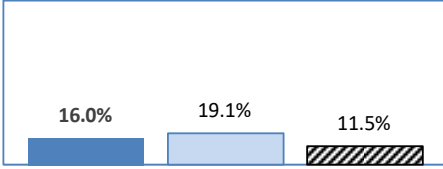

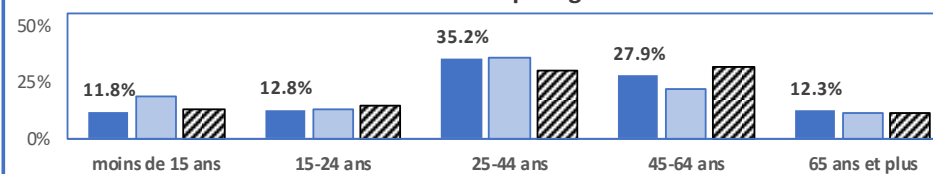

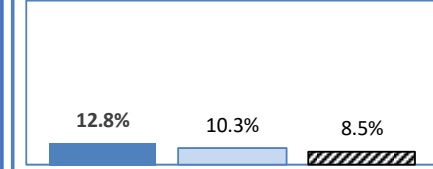

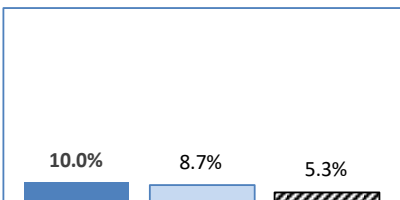
Structure par âge



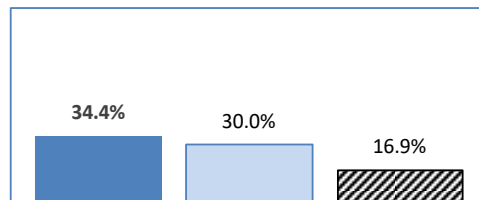
Taux de chômage



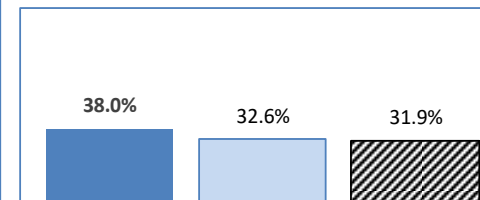

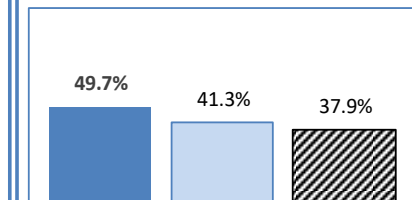
Seuil de faible revenu
