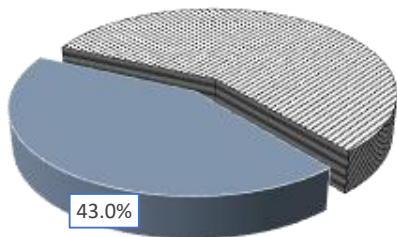

Share of English-speaking Population

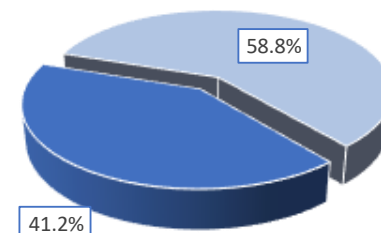

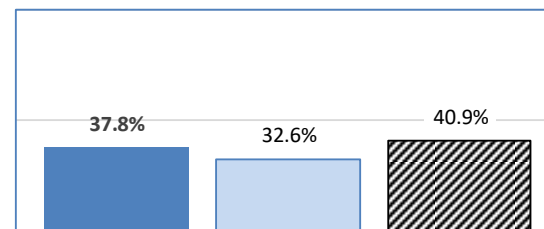

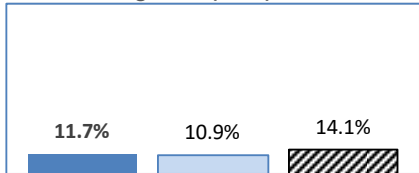
Lone Parent Family (Total)



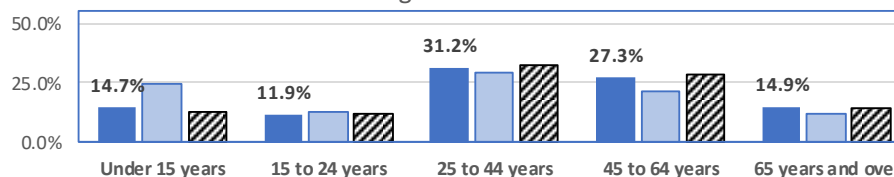
Low Education (15+)



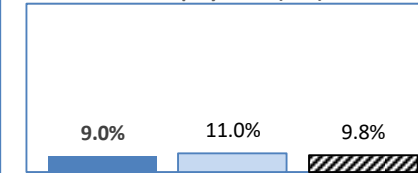
Living Alone (Total)



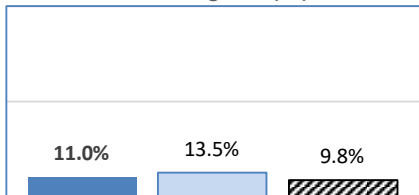
Age Structure



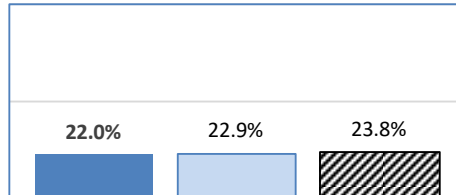
Unemployment (15+)



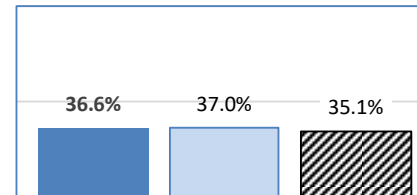

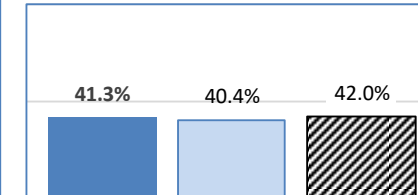

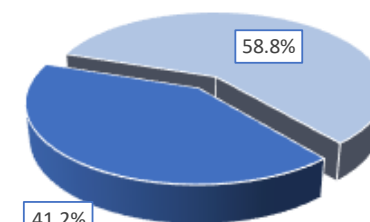

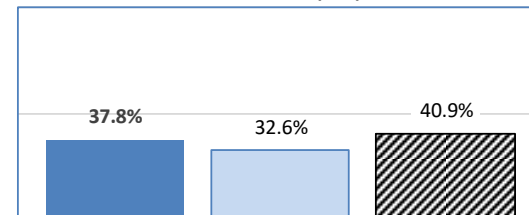

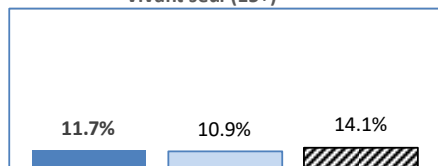
Familles monoparentales (totale)



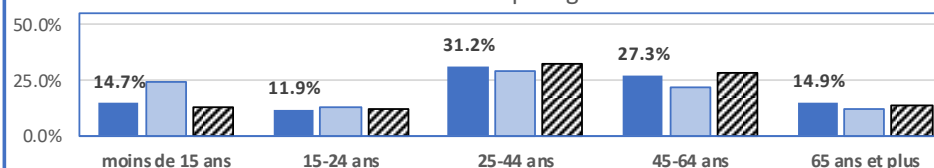
Éducation faible (15+)



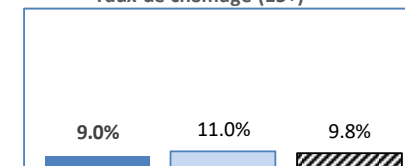

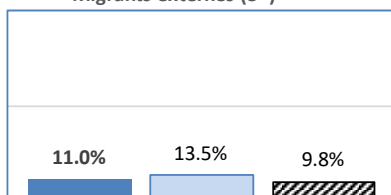
Structure par âge



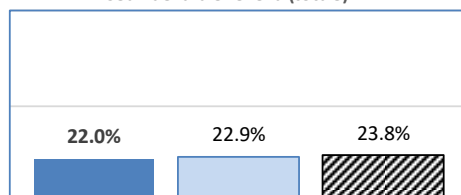
Taux de chômage (15+)



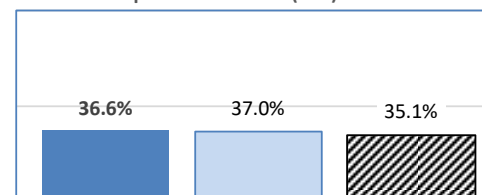

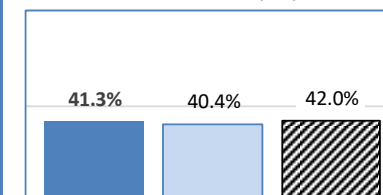
