



The Walkley centre is situated a the corner of a major road (Côte-Saint-Luc road) and a residential one-way street (Walkley street).







Residents:

- More greenier in place
- This should be the spot for cooling stations
- More welcoming
- No indicator of what this building is and hours
- More picnic tables, recycling and garbage containers
- Can we take over garden beds and manage them
- Large closed cage???? (see image on the right)
- Large parking lot should be less parking and adapted to use all the space
- Community center makes me feel safe

#### Partners:

- Parking lot is too large
- No signage re speed limit
- More garden beds
- Bus stop not comfortable contributes to heat
- Lots of cement
- No signage re: Children, school route etc
- A large street encourages speed
- Very difficult for people with reduced mobility
- Should be cooling stations here
- No crossing guard lots of children come to the center
- Very few bicycle racks
- No countdown timer on traffic lights for pedestrians



- Plant bigger trees for more shade
- Draw reflective paintings on the ground (crosswalk and parking)
- Add curb extension at the intersection
- Make Walkley street less wide by giving more space to pedestrians and cyclists.
- Build a green roof or reflective roof on the community center's building
- Add small fencing on Côte-Saint-Luc side for protection

Restricted access to green space. Should be made accessible to residents







Signs that impose fines for garbage should be put







#### Residents:

- Garbage bins overrun the sidewalk
- Street is too wide and barren to feel secure
- It seems reasonably secure in the day
- Deserted building
- Penalize landlords for garbage bins and recycling
- Residents have no access to green space at their apartments

#### Partners:

- Lacking bicycle parking
- 5140 ex: Yard is not closed could feel unsafe for families with small children
- No real bicycle path lacking support to feel secure on bicycles
- Street is too large
- The street can be narrowed without losing parking
- No bicycle parking / not inviting for cyclists (lots of buildings have no elevators cannot bring bikes 3 flights of stairs
- No cover for the bus stop
- Lots of cement with reduced mobility
- Markings are proven to work to reduce speed

- Sidewalks needs to be repaired
- Narrow the street and add planters and seating
- Bicycle parking
- City should require landlords to allow their residents to have access to their lawns
- Garbage and recycling bins are a big problem. Landlords and residents should be part of the solution
- There needs to be a specific action to clean up the street way too dirty

#### Residents:

- Cars don't make full stops
- Lacking traffic lights
- Crossing the street as a pedestrian is risky
- Secure with 3 stop signs
- Crosswalks not painted well
- Kids very vulnerable crossing the streets

#### Partners:

- Very large intersection
- School bus stop: cars don't respect the indicator from the school bus
- Street is too large
- Nothing in the intersection is conceived on human scale
- Dangerous even for drivers. Drivers are vulnerable
- The street can be narrowed without losing parking
- Very difficult for people with reduced mobility
- Cars are parked too close to the intersection for drivers to turn safely



- Traffic lights
- Sheltered bus stop on south side of Fielding
- Clearly marked bicycle paths
- Narrow the street and add planters and seating
- Bicycle parking
- Bixi station
- Repair the sidewalks
- Increase visibility for drivers with parking further away from the curb

## 4 Somerled Walkley

#### Residents:

- Too much cement (heat island)
- Not very dirty
- Not very inviting
- Nothing wrong with this stop
- No continuity with bicycle paths
- No traffic and stop signs

#### Partners:

- Very grey lots of cement (starting from Walkley)
- Mixed functions (commercial and residential)
- Ugly place and very hot in summer
- Not enough trees
- Can be improved (more greenery on sidewalks even if it's not enough shadowed)
- Bicycle path not improved
- Cars and cement prioritized
- Not comfortable for pedestrians
- Protected bicycle path on Walkley is recommended
- Large blind wall / Green wall and Mural
- Cars are using the car service station as shortcut to turn left



- Plant vertically on the "Metro" market wall on Walkley (ex: Vine wall)
- Switch the parking lane on Walkley with the bike lane to have a secured biking lane near the sidewalk
- Install benches / or picnic tables all along the green wall on Walkley
- Install bike stations on Somerled
- Provide "abri bus" on bus stop on the intersection Somerled/Walkley
- Planting trees all along sidewalk to reduce heat effect






#### Comments:
