ENGLISH SPEAKING COMMUNITY OF THE MAGDALEN ISLANDS AT A GLANCE

This is a community visioning project called "The Future is Now" which reflects the need to ensure the long-term vitality of the English-speaking community of the Magdalen Islands. The proactive process has been guided by knowledge development and involved community mobilization, strategic planning, and the involvement of partners and local stakeholders in developing a course of action – a road map – that will lay out where the community wants to be in the future.




- Greater integration with the Francophone community

- Drop-out rates still high among boys particularly


PROJECTED DECLINE 2011-2031



The lower birth rate combined with outmigration is a particularly worrisome trend. The school on Entry Island has already closed and the school in Grosse Ile has only about one third of the students it once housed at the peak of the baby boom in the late 60's

NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN GROSSE ILE SCHOOL



In 2018 of those who began grade 7 in Grosse-Ile:

- 60% graduated (40% did not)
- 55% are still living on the islands (45% are not)

IN ADDITION

44% OF GRADUATES STAYED

74% OF NON-GRADUATES STAYED

- The population is declining steadily over time.
- This could lead to a situation where the community is no longer viable
- Declining school numbers, potentially affect the quality of school life and access to specialized services for students.
- There is a lack of post-secondary and adult education opportunities in the English language on the Islands
- Many people are very reliant on the lobster fishery, so if there is a downturn, they are extremely vulnerable
- Many residents do not have good enough skills in French to occupy jobs outside of the English-speaking community
- High incomes within the fishery make it difficult to recruit workers for other types of work

- While average household incomes are high, there are disparities in the community, with women often earning much less than men, resulting in disadvantages
- Long-standing institutions such as the municipality, CAMI and the church will face difficulties in recruiting the next generation of leaders and ensuring sustainability.
- The fact that essential services are lacking, makes it extremely difficult to attract newcomers.
- There are few houses and/or apartments to rent
- There are no daycare services
