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Introduction

Each year KIDS Summer Camps accommodates the youth and parents in five (5) municipalities across the Lower North Shore (Blanc Sablon. St. Paul's River, St. Augustine, La Tabatiere and the Eau-Naturelle Discovery Camp in Chevery). These camps provide a safe and happy environment, a unique learning experience for all those involved, as well as assist the camp counsellors with leadership skills that will help them in their future endeavors. It is a place where youth can interact with other youth in an adventurous, natural and spiritual environment. Therefore, the continuation and expansion of the KIDS Summer Camp is an important service to the population of the Lower North Shore.

The mission of the KIDS Summer Camp is "To nurture and develop a safe and healthy environment in which youth can improve their health and obtain skills that will assist them in their future lives, through physical activities (baseball, track-n-field, soccer, etc...), mental development (leadership training, mentoring, etc...), artistic growth (music, art, dance, etc...), environment awareness (greenhouse, composting, nature watching, etc...) and community/family participation (volunteers, family/community events, etc...)"

This year's theme for KIDS Summer Camp 2009 was *Going Green* some of the activities included were water games, nature walks, recycling crafts, beach clean up, camp out, outdoor/indoor sports and flower planting, etc. These activities gave the kids an idea on what "Going Green" actually meant. Ideas such as; awareness of dangers to our environment, skills to aid in a greener lifestyle, appreciation for the environment, learn team leadership and communication skills, learn the benefits of a green lifestyle, and experience a healthier lifestyle though sports and arts activities. Thus, this theme will provide the children with a greater point of view of how and why taking care of the environment is important.

Overview of Project

Jenny Thomas was hired as the new Youth Camp Coordinator and began work on May 4th, 2009 through to October 25th, 2009 (21 weeks). Some of the duties were:

- Coordinate summer camp program all ready established (5)
- Implement (1) new summer camp (Old Fort Bay).
- Develop new strategies for registration.
- Supervise camp counsellors.
- Oversee the overall working administration for the 2009 camps.

This year (2009) the five (5) camps already established were maintained and an additional camp was initiated but was unsuccessful due to lack of interest and participation from the parents in Old Fort Bay.

Reports/Documentation

An application was submitted to Services Canada for five (5) student camp counsellor positions (one per camp site) for eight (8) weeks, which was accepted.

An application was submitted to Young Canada Works for seven (7) student camp counsellor positions (one per camp site) and one (1) student animator position to research and create an implement plan for the French Immersion Teen Camp for ten (10) weeks. Young Canada Works approved all eight positions, covering 70% of the salary and the remaining funds were covered by the inscription fees from each camp site. Also, housing allowance of \$1.35 per hour was provided which brought the total salary per hour up to

\$10.35, and the travel expenses to and from the camp site (to their place of study) was also covered.

Contributions of Partners

The KIDS Summer Camp requires funding from a variety of sources. Through the commitment and support from organizations and businesses on and off the coast the necessary funding was secured to maintain the four (4) camps established, as well as continue supporting the Eau Naturelle Discover camp in Chevery. Outcome of 2009 Camp

The 2009 camp year began on June 29th until August 14th, 2009 (7 weeks). The theme for the camp was *Going Green*, the weekly topics were based on environmental friendly themes such as horticulture, recycling, clean air, etc.

At the end of the 2009 camp year an evaluation questionnaire was dispersed to the families who participated in this year's camp. The questionnaire will be utilized to improve the quality of the services offered and determine the feasibility of the continuation and expansion of the camps in the years to come. The results of the questionnaire has been compiled and disseminated, and are included in this report.

Youth/Counsellors

The number of counsellors hired each year is determined by the number of youth who are pre-registered. Camp rules stipulate that there must be one (1) student camp counsellor per seven (7) youth. The table below indicates the number of youth registered for the 2009 camp and states who were hired in each campsite:

A total of sixty-eight (68) youth attended the 2009 KIDS Summer Camp in the five (5) camps along the Lower North Shore and eleven (11) student jobs were created.

As you will notice from the above table that the number of youth has declined from the 2008 camp year, this is due to the fact that the ten (10) to twelve (12) age group are no longer interested in this type of camp. They would like to have a camp implemented that has more outdoor and adventurous activity involved such as visiting different places, swimming pool, camping etc.. Also the table only shows ten (10) students hired, the extra student hired didn't work directly in the camp but as an assistant to the youth coordinator. The duties consisted of aiding with the set up of all camps as well as helping with the development of the weekly schedules.

Training

On June 22nd to the 26th, training was held through video conferencing for the eleven (11) student camp counsellors. The curriculum included information about the work schedule, policies/procedures/responsibilities, camp rules and regulations, camp goals, camp daily operations, safety, salary and pay check, administration, camp behaviour management, communication, disciplinary actions, purchasing requirements and lines of communication, and the first aid guide. The training was carried out by the following persons:


This training provided the counsellors with the resources needed in order to successfully complete their task as student camp counsellors. It also provided them with valuable skills that will assist them in their future endeavours'.


Question #1: Rate your overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.

• It was not excellent, but room for a lot of improvement to make it more fun. On average it was more boring days than fun days.


Question #2: Rate your child's overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.


Question #3: Rate your overall satisfaction with the student camp counsellors.

Question #5: What changes, if any, would you like to see implemented for the upcoming year?


- More screening for counsellors, set up a panel -parents, coasters, other public person (mayor) for hiring.

And while the camp is a great idea the whole concept needs to be promoted more successfully and better organized. If this was done more participation would be seen.
- It might be a good idea to check with parents before hiring any counsellors.


Question #1: Rate your overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.

• My child attended maybe 7 days all summer. She said it was boring and the counsellors did not participate in any games with them.


Question #2: Rate your child's overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.

Question #5: What changes, if any, would you like to see implemented for the upcoming year?


- I would like to see counsellors actually interested in the camp and children. I think an adult should be one of the people hired for the summer weeks.


Question #1: Please rate your overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.

• Our community doesn't have much to offer children during summer periods. The summer camp is wonderful.


Question #2: Please rate your child's overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.

My child was bored and did not want to go.


Question #3: Please rate your overall satisfaction with the student camp counsellors.

- A screened tent outside so children could do some activities even when the flies are bad, or to use as a place to just sit and draw or read in the fresh air.


Question #6: Other suggestions and/or comments.


Question #1: Please rate your overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.

- She enjoyed it very much.


Question #2: Please rate your child's overall satisfaction with the KIDS Summer Camp.


Question #3: Please rate your overall satisfaction with the student camp counsellors.

Recommendations

The 2009 camp year has been a very rewarding experience and the majority of the youth enjoyed their camping experience but as with every endeavour each year is an opportunity to learn new ways to improve the quality of the KIDS Summer Camp and ways to operate more efficiently.

Listed below are recommendations for the upcoming 2010 camp:

Coordinator

- Have a full time KIDS Summer Camp Coordinator. If not, hire part-time from the month of April to the month of October yearly.
- Hold registration a month prior to the beginning of camp.
- The camp hours should be from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm, (including lunch hour) leaving half an hour for the counselors to clean and prepare for the next day.
- The KIDS Summer Camp theme and weekly binders be completed by the month of May.
- Having a budget for the Camp Coordinator to visit ALL five (5) camp sites at least once during the seven (7) weeks of camp.
- A survey developed and completed to gather information on what communities and children are interested in attending the KIDS Summer Camp before the end of April.
- Have the student counsellors hired by the month of April for Young Canada Works and May for Services Canada.
- Better promotion of the camps.
- Purchase covered or screen tents to assist with the flies.
- Swimming to be done at a pool, not a lake.
- List children attending each day.
- Maintain partnerships and establish new partners for the continuation and expansion of the KIDS Summer Camps, as well as to implement new activities and better accommodate ages 10-12.
- Provide parents with the weekly schedule of activities to prepare their child for each day.
- Having at least fourteen (14) kids enrolled before the opening of the camp.
- Provide counselors with daily activities to be better prepared and structured.

Counsellors

- Have one (1) male counselor hired per camp if possible.
- Hire one (1) adult counselor to be head counselor in each camp site instead of hiring all student counselors. (Ex: Quebec En-forme, YMCA, YWCA)
- The counselors level of education shouldn't be the main factor in hiring, it should be based on personality and interests as well.
- Students to be more professional on the job.

Parents

- All weeks of enrollment would have to be paid in advance of camp.
- Establish a Selection Committee of key representation in each community to hire motivated students. Also have a parent from the camp site involved in the selection.

Conclusion

In 2010 we will attempt to open an additional camp. A survey will be conducted in early winter to research the interest and number of children in the communities along the Lower North Shore who would want to participate in the KIDS Summer Camp. The results of this survey will identify the location of the communities to implement the camps for the summer of 2010.

The continuation and expansion of the KIDS Summer Camp to all communities along the Lower North is vital to the youth on the Lower North Shore and it is a worthwhile initiative, one that I am proud to be apart of.

The KIDS Summer Camp is a special place where the youth are set apart from the pace of everyday life and the student camp counsellors nurture the potential in them through their abundant curiosity and capacity for learning.

Having said that, it is crucial that the partners continue to support the KIDS Summer Camp and new partnerships are formed, otherwise it will be impossible for the Coasters Association to continue the implementation of the camps.
