Dear Supporters;

It was another big year for 4 Korners! The past year was full of challenges, ideas and solutions. It was our first full year in the new location and the last nine months of the year were led by a new Executive Director. We examined the financial uniqueness of 4 Korners and implemented a plan to ensure the sustainability of the organization. The future is bright with change and movement! Technological habits of accessing resources and information are shifting along with societal priorities which will present new and adapted initiatives.

The focus of 2017-2018 was to adapt the new location and leadership to the strategic direction, to ensure the stability of the organization under the transition of staff and leadership, continue our programming and activities, make sure we were out in the communities of the Laurentians, increase our presence on social media and listen. We flew through the year thanks to key staff, board and volunteers that were knowledgeable, supportive, adaptive and positive. We thank you all intensely for this.

After a flip chart with a blank piece of paper and some markers at the Open House with the question; "what do you wish to see in you community?" and an online survey to members concerning their wishes for programs and services – that had 81 responses and a 20% answer rate – we allocated a bit of unrestricted funds directly to a program opportunity fund, had two small fundraisers and implemented four new programs that will all be carried over to the next year. Some of these include; Women's Wellness evenings with different topics and guests each time, the monthly family craft nights, a new playgroup with activities in Rosemère and our weekly Walking group for seniors and caregivers. Our office in Lachute has expanded its partnerships and is serving multiple communities now thanks to the funding received for our Senior Wellness Program in isolated communities.

The next year, we will be reviewing our strategic plan, continuing our services to promote access to health and social services in the minority-language with partners all over the Laurentians, building our branch of community development initiatives – with a new grant received for the minority-language community in Deux-Montagnes - and evaluating the needs in des Laurentides and Pays-d'en-Haut.

With that, we invite you to see what is brewing in the next year by signing up for our newsletter, following us on social media, supporting us with a membership or your time and skills as a volunteer, or just simply joining us in one of the many vast events we offer in the Laurentian region.

It's been a full-packed year of meeting many new people and places that we reach and I am humbled by the fact that I get to serve as Executive Director of 4 Korners Family Resource Center, in the beautiful Laurentians on the land of the traditional and unceded territory of the Haudenosauneega (St Lawrence Iroquois) peoples; Kanien'kehá:ka (Mohawk) nation.



ACCESS TO HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES IN ENGLISH





Working with our public health partners to improve access to health and social services in the minority-language.

THE HEALTH CARAVAN

The Health, Justice and Social Services Caravan in collaboration with John Abbott College took services to 5 towns in 4 MRC's. Over 500 high school students were exposed to possible career paths in the sectors represented. They also gained knowledge interacting with the John Abbott students.

The communities were welcome to drop in and have various basic health tests, some of which are not regularly given at a general check-up. This year the students and their teachers consulted with at least 90 seniors.

Each year, there is a story to tell about how the Caravan saved a life. This year was no exception and an intervention saved another life of a non-French-speaking person who desperately needed help and had no where to go. Offering the best possible health and social services to a society's citizens are a measure of success and human decency.

The Health Passport





The Health Passport is available as an app to download online or as a paper booklet. Gave out approx. 550 Health passports at vaccination clinics in Mirabel and Lachute.

Networking & Partnership Initiative

4 Korners Family Resource Center, through a grant from the CHSSN (Community Health and Social Services Network) and Health Canada, sponsors a network called the Laurentian English Services Advisory Network (LESAN).

LESAN is a network of citizens affiliated with organizations and public institutions who work to improve the health and vitality of the English-speaking communities of the Laurentians.

Members of the LESAN committees sit at various round tables throughout the region to communicate the needs of the English-speaking population and to bring information to the English-speaking community.

In 2015, a Communication Committee was formed. This allowed for an improved flow of information, support and solidarity between the LESAN working groups. The Committee's communication kit is available on the 4 Korners website to reach individuals, organizations and institutions.



A day in the life of a caregiver

Have you helped your neighbour or a family member that is caring for someone lately? Did you know that isolation and burn out is common amongst those taking care of someone? Many hours per week are spent caring for these family members (median of 14 hours for spouses and 10 hours for children). Caregivers perform a range of tasks in caring for their family member or friend. Below are the tasks most commonly reported.

I felt reassured when I asked that a volunteer from 4 Korners phone my mother on weekday mornings. Mom lived alone in a seniors independent living apartment. Her glaucoma got worse and her vision was quite bad. She did not mingle with other people in her building; only saying hello when she got in the elevator to get her mail, have her hair done or to buy a few things at the "dep" downstairs.

These phone calls were wonderful and a very kind lady named Gerri would chat with her each morning. If Gerri couldn't call, it would be Gertrude. My mind was at ease, especially when my husband and I would go out of town. A couple of times mom didn't answer her phone and I would get a phone call to make sure that everything was ok. These reassurance calls were as important for me as for my mom.

Sadly, my mother passed away in August. I will never forget the kindness of 4 Korners to have this program and I am very grateful. Thank you so much...Marsha
