SUPPORTING THE ESCQ

CAMPAIGN TO HAVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND LABOUR MARKET DEVELOPMENT RECOGNIZED AS PILLAR OF OLMC VITALITY MOVING FORWARD

In the context of slower economic growth, the possibility of a shallow recession this year, a predicted increase in unemployment in 2023, and a continuing battle with inflation, the renewal of the 2023-2028 Official Languages (OL) Action Plan takes on greater significance from an economic and labour market development perspective.

CEDEC intensified its campaign to meet with Ministers and Members of Parliament and rally their support for making Collaborative Economic and Labour Market Development a pillar of the next Official Languages Act and the 2023-2028 OL Action Plan. In its communications, it is emphasizing the importance of robust and long-term economic and labour market development strategies to support continuing Official Language Minority Communities' (OLMC) progress in terms of job growth, business and social enterprise development and increased participation in national, regional, and local economic growth.

Following the 2023 federal budget, John Buck, President and CEO of CEDEC wrote to the **Minister of Official Languages**, The Hon. Ginette Petitpas Taylor, outlining **the bottom lines** the English-speaking Community of Quebec (ESCQ) will use to assess the Government's commitment to economic and labour market development.

In his post-2023 budget letter to the Minister, the President and CEO re-emphasized that:

- Economic and labour market development is foundational to developing the vitality of the ESCQ.
- Economic and labour market development strategies and solutions must be fashioned "by and for the ESCQ."
- Economic and labour market development strategies for the OLMC in Quebec must focus on **inclusion and innovation**, be **results-based**, and contribute significantly to **building cohesion within the ESCQ**.

In his post-2023 budget letter to the **Minister of Official Languages**, the President and CEO of CEDEC declares that **economic and labour market development strategies** for the OLMCs in Quebec must take a long-term view and provide substantial and targeted support to:

 Enhance the contribution of the ESCQ to the growth and development of Quebec's economy. Reduce the economic disparities and disadvantages experienced by the community.

In the run up to the release of the 2023-2028 OL Action Plan, CEDEC will continue to engage and enroll Ministers and MPs in supporting **Collaborative Economic and Labour Market Development** as a pillar of the next Action Plan.

CEDEC MEETS MP BRENDA SHANAHAN TO DISCUSS ECONOMIC AND LABOUR MARKET DEVELOPMENT FOR ESCQ



John Buck, President and CEO of CEDEC recently met with **Brenda Shanahan, MP for Châteauguay-Lacolle**, and urged her to support making economic and labour market development an **essential pillar of strengthening the vitality** of Official Language Minority Communities (OLMCs) across the country, especially the English-speaking Community in Quebec (ESCQ).

Given her national status and influence as **Chair of the Liberal Caucus**, Mr. Buck encouraged Ms. Shanahan to leverage her significant influence to enroll her MP colleagues in having economic and labour market development recognized and appropriately funded in the upcoming 2023-2028 Official Language Action Plan.

BAIE-COMEAU PORT OF CALL PREPARING TO HIRE MORE BILINGUAL GUIDES



As part of the Canada-New England cruise itinerary, Baie-Comeau welcomed 17 cruise ships and over 10,000 cruise ship tourists in 2022. The same, if not more cruise ship activity, is expected in 2023.

CEDEC is currently supporting public, private, and civil society partners in the region, including the **North Shore Community Association** (NSCA) and **Croisières Baie-Comeau** in recruiting and training bilingual tourist guides for jobs in Baie-Comeau's growing tourism industry. Catering to cruise shippers' linguistic needs with bilingual guides will provide tourists with a better experience and entice them to spend more time and money in Baie-Comeau.

The training for the new guides will be offered between May 8 and 10, 2023. It will focus on local history and stories about specific tourist attractions. E'Space K, a local theatre group, will train the guides on storytelling and how to engage and hold the attention of an audience. Port Baie-Comeau is one of nine St. Lawrence cruise ports of call - together with Quebec City, Trois-Rivieres, Saguenay, Montreal, Sept-Îles, Gaspe, Havre-Saint-Pierre, and the Magdalen Islands.

GRADUATE LEVEL PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION MICROPROGRAM FOR ENGLISH-SPEAKING UNIVERSITY STUDENTS





The Consortium of English-language CEGEPs, Colleges and Universities of Quebec (CELCCUQ) has partnered with the École nationale d'administration publique (ÉNAP), i.e., University of Public Administration, to develop a new, part-time graduate-level microprogram in public administration tailored to Quebec's English-speaking university graduates.

This innovative program targets recent graduates from the Consortium's three university members, **Bishop's**, **Concordia**, and **McGill**, who possess a bachelor's degree and have an interest in a career in Quebec's public service. This collaboration is intended to **build rewarding public service career pathways** for graduates from these universities, while also addressing the long-standing **under-representation of Quebec's English-speaking community** in the province's public service.

The microprogram will launch in **September 2023**, and registration must be completed by **June 1, 2023**. The program will be delivered in French at l'ÉNAP's Montreal campus with additional language support. For more information, please <u>click here</u>.
