
2016 PAT LEWIS PEACE PRIZE

2016 PAT LEWIS HUMANITARIAN AWARD

For an individual or group, at the elementary school level, who has shown outstanding efforts toward a humanitarian cause.

SJF Elementary Community Walk—Over the past seven years, St. John Fisher Elementary School, together with the Home and School Association (HandS) has organized a Community Walk fundraiser. The purpose of our Community Walk is to develop an awareness in the students that there are people in our local community who are in need and to also teach the students about the importance of giving back to our community.

Over six hundred students raise funds by asking family, neighbours, and friends to donate towards this great cause. Together the students, staff and parents then participle in a 2km walk around the Valois (Pointe Claire) community in the month of May. Local merchants and residents come out to cheer on the students and the local police happily escort the very long trail of walkers thus making the event a wonderful school spirited time together - rain or shine! Each year we raise about \$8000.00; 10% of the funds raised is given to our SJF Social ActionTeam and to three local organizations.

The 2015 organizations that benefitted from our fundraiser are:

Big Brothers and Sisters of the West Island: A child and youth mentoring charity that facilitates life-changing relationships.

West Island Citizen Advocacy: Recruits, screens and matches volunteer advocates with those who are handicapped, disadvantaged, or senior.

Youth Unlimited La Corde: A youth centre that offers many meals a week to 50 kids, an after-schools pot for children to hang out, mentoring programs and so much more.

SJF Social Action Team: Empowers students to make a difference in our communities, our country and around the world through a group project.





2016 PAT LEWIS HUMANITARIAN AWARD

For an individual or group, at the elementary school level, who has shown outstanding efforts toward a humanitarian cause.

The Chelsea-Enyandeni School Twinning Project began in the fall of 2009. The project aims to connect Chelsea Elementary students and staff to a school community in rural Africa. This project is the second international school twinning that Céline Brault has spearheaded in the time that she has been at Chelsea.

In October 2009, M me Brault helped a team of Grade 6 students to prepare an audio-visual presentation to introduce Chelsea students to Zimbabwe and to provide insights into day-to-day life in the rural community of Enyandeni in Matabeleland, Zimbabwe. In January 2010, Mme Brault travelled to Enyandeni to deliver the package to the school. The staff and students of Enyandeni Primary warmly welcomed her family at an all school assembly that marked the official launch of the twinning project.

Since then, Chelsea Elementary students have sent several packages containing personal letters and beautiful class projects, such as books and trilingual dictionaries written and illustrated by Chelsea students. To date, Chelsea School has raised over \$7 000, which helped Enyandeni Primary School build a much-needed class room for the Kindergarten students. This year, the Cycle 3 students of Chelsea Elementary continue to write letters and share information and will be raising funds to help build a school library.








2016 GORDON PATERSON AWARD

He is not just a commissioner, he is a father, a teacher, a mentor and a wonderful resource for parents. He can usually be seen at schools in Hudson and St. Lazare, attending meetings, talking with parents and staff, attending music concerts, craft fairs and is always there for support. After a long day of work at the EMSB with a group of special needs young a dults, Danny is usually scheduled running from one governing board meeting to another at Evergreen, Birchwood, Mount Pleasant, Forest Hill JR and SR and Westwood JR and SR, all the while trying to keep up with the Montreal Canadiens hockey scores in between. He has

been a member of the Westwood Home and School for many, many years even though his own son is well off to university these days and entering the work world.

After graduating from Concordia, Danny began his teaching career in 1977 with the Protestant School Board of Greater Montreal and the Shawbridge Youth Centres. He was one of the first teachers at the newly formed Mountainview School, the first English social service school in Montreal. He took a brief leave in 1990 to teach in the northern Quebec community of Chisasibi with the Cree School Board. Upon his return in 1993, Danny found he could use his experiences from Chisasibi with the ever-increasing number of students with severe learning disabilities back at Batshaw, where he still works every day as a teacher/consultant with a group of disabled young adults.

Despite his busy schedule, Danny usually manages to attend our monthly home and school meetings at Westwood where he gives us a heads up of what is happening that concerns us at the school board, has helped us through the last 2 major school changes at LBPS B and with the current issues with Bill 86. Forevering ood humor, Danny is always available after meetings, by email or any time to help out parents with questions on any thing. He will even continue discussions in the school parking lot long after the custodians have closed up and left! As a long time member of the LBPS B Special Needs Advisory Committee, he is an especially knowledgeable resource for parents where special needs children are concerned. Any question you have on IEPs, programs available in the LBPSB and EMSB, Danny will always make time for parents. He knows what it is like navigating the system with a child with special needs. Danny is also famous for his apple pies, which he graciously donates several to the Westwood Craft Fair Bake Sale each fall. You have to get there early to buy one since they fly off the tables! Danny is always a welcome sight at our Home and School and feel he is a most-deserving recipient of the Gordon Paterson Award!
