As for upcoming courses.....



Tablet-lending program for MCLL members



"Apeirogon, a Novel" (2020) is written in an unconventional form, focusing on two real men, grieving fathers, whose young daughters die as a result of violence. Their meeting and unlikely friendship results in



'Combatants for Peace', an organization established for Israelis and Palestinians to co-exist with respect and compassion. The second book is "Let the Great World Spin". McCann's allegory of 9/11 articulates the voices of seemingly disparate characters, drawn together by hope, beauty and a tightrope walker's "artistic crime of the century."

Are you ready for a purposeful but fun brainstorm on MCLL's future in McGill's storied Faculty Club? If so, save the date and plan to join us for the hybrid MCLL Members' Forum, Friday, October 18, from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

At 35 years, our MCLL is entering middle age. Our theme reflects this: "Honouring the Past, Looking towards the Future." To get us started, we'll hear from Dean Carola Weil of McGill's School of Continuing Studies, and Forum Moderator Marjorie Northrup, who will outline the goals of the day.
