On Monday, June 5, 2023, Montrealers awoke to the sad news; Egbert Gaye had passed the night before. That news went fast and hit hard, in fact, it was gutting for many, particularly those in Montreal's English speaking Black Caribbean Community.

Today, and for many days, months and years ahead, we will mourn his absence from our scene. He and his trusty camera, booming laughter, stories and incredible, ever present, wit will be missing, but no doubt will remain and live on in our hearts and memories: collective and individual.

This is a sad time. Mr. Gaye was a man with presence. He had the ability, fortitude to challenge and question the status quo. He championed equality and inclusion particularly for Black people. He left his mark here in Montreal, across Canada and many other places unknown to most.

The members and board of the Jamaica Association of Montreal send condolences to his family, his colleagues, his team at Community Contact, and his friends. We as a community cherished him in so many ways and he was our rock through the Community Contact.

You taught us valuable lessons, ones that we will keep and build upon to create better communities here in Montreal and wherever we go in this lifetime.
