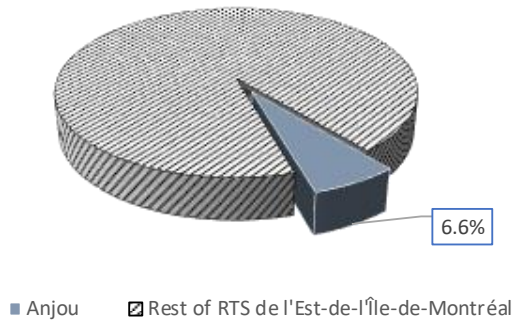

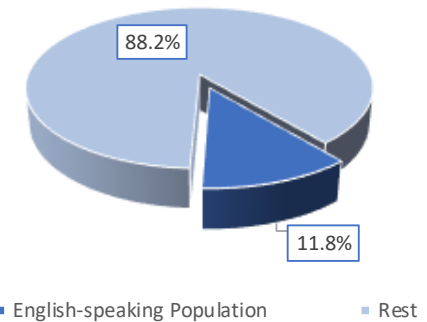
Share of English-speaking Population



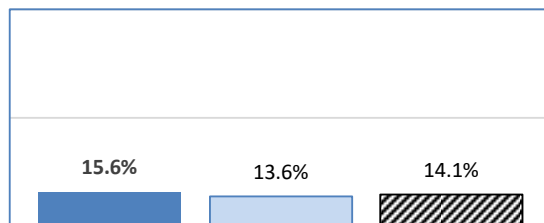

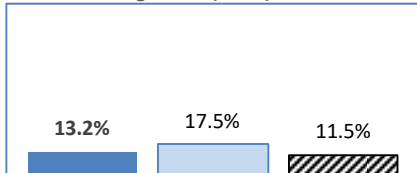

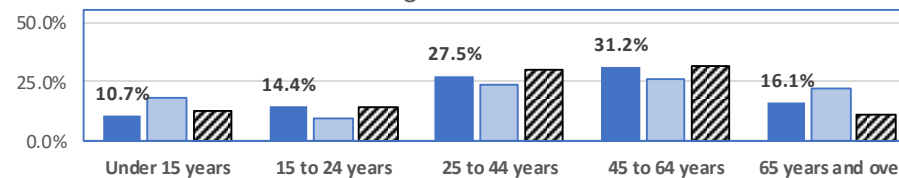

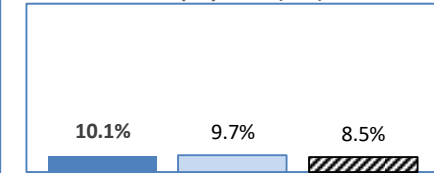

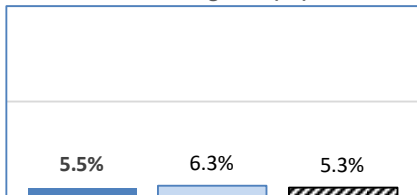

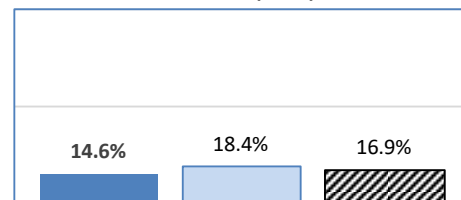

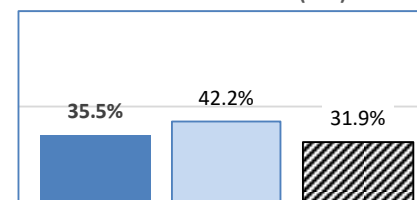

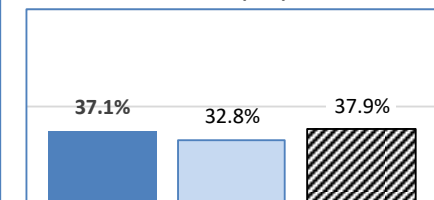

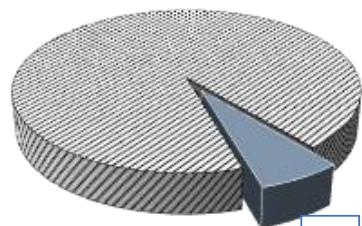

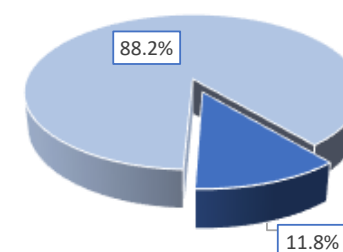

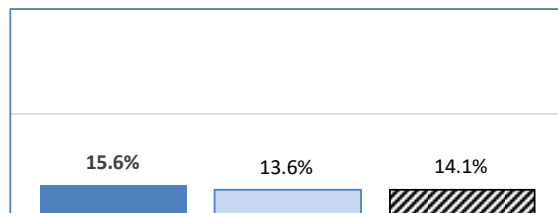

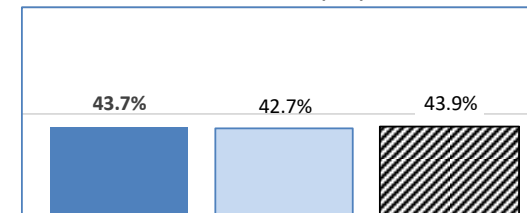

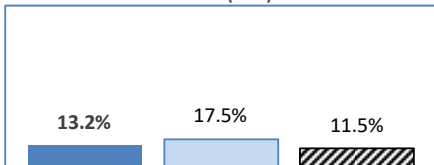
Familles monoparentales (totale)



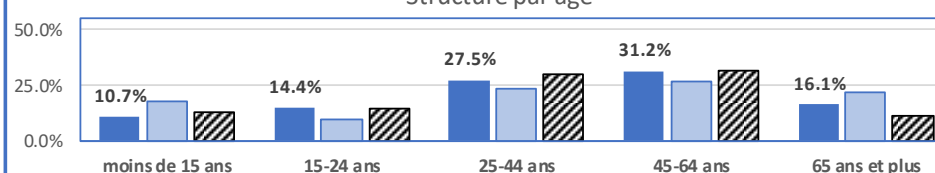

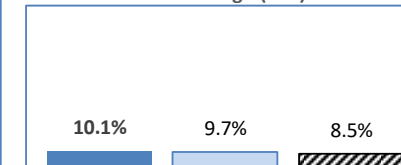

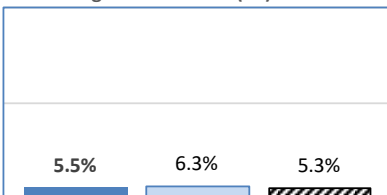
Structure par âge



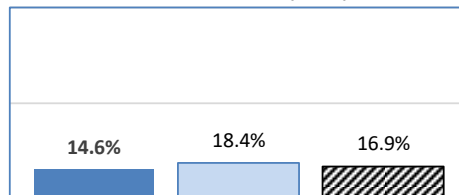
Taux de chômage (15+)



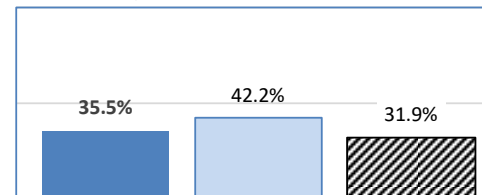

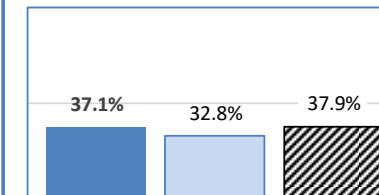
