## **Remembrance Day**

We would love to share this letter by Enoch Lee (Capt) addressing teachers, staff, and volunteers of Gault Institute in 2022 Remembrance Day:



Dear teachers, staff, and volunteers of Gault Institute,

I wanted to take a moment to sincerely thank you for the privilege of attending today's Remembrance Day ceremony at your school. What a thoughtful, well prepared, and meaningful ceremony it was. As I shared in the staff room afterwards, I am indebted to the sacrifices of Canadian soldiers who fought so valiantly during the Korean War for my grandparent's freedom. In particular, the Princess Patricia's Light Infantry Regiment who played a pivotal role in turning the tide of the war by defending Hill 355, which was a Regiment that was founded and established by Hamilton Gault, the son of Frederick Gault whom your school is named after. Though I was a guest, I, myself, was there to pay respects to the historical significance that the Gault family represents to me and my birth country; It was an honour to be in attendance for many reasons. I also saw the faces of my own children (Noah 4 and Jimmy 3) represented in every child that attended and it reminded me of the honour and privilege of wearing this uniform.

I wanted to thank you all because as you greeted me and shook my hand, your warm and kind energy and smiles reminded me of a very special teacher named Mrs. Chris Thullner. My family emigrated from South Korea in 1997 and we found ourselves in the harsh winter of Winnipeg, MB. I didn't even know the alphabet and it was a hard transition due to the cultural differences and my lack of English. Today, I was reminded of my Gr. 4 teacher who took me out of ESL classes and accommodated me in her classroom. She made me feel included, she paid special attention to me, she tailored every assignment for me, she tutored me after school every Thursday one-on-one, and even helped me make friends by affirming my hobby of drawing. In short, she went above and beyond. Most importantly, I will never forget her warmth, her smiles, her hugs and her encouragements. Today, each person that I met, shared in the same spirit of love and passion for nurturing these precious little ones and sowing seeds of life-giving encouragements.

I want to take a moment and recognize all of you as the underappreciated and unsung heroes of our society. Thank you for all that you do for the children, all that you put up with, in sickness and in health, through thick and thin, through COVID, you did not give up on teaching, mentoring, loving and raising the next generation. Though we did not share many words, you have inspired me and encouraged me - we are all one the same team. I can tell that Gault Institute is blessed with special people who have selflessly given themselves so that our children may grow up and do the same. It was very touching to be in your midst. To be reminded. This Sunday, I will pass on the children's thank you notes to the Veterans of Legion 146 in Beauharnois.
