Accommodations for out-of-town delegates will be made at:-Beausejour Motel (Tel. 631-4537) 1010 Herron Road

Dorval, Quebec H9S 1B3

The Beausejour Motel is just south of the 2 & 20 Highway in Dorval. The Herron Road address is the service road that runs parallel to the highway. The 2 & 20 is a main east/west highway through Montreal. Dorval is just outside Montreal proper, going west. The motel is right next the Dorval Shopping Center which has boutiques, stores (including The Bay) and restaurants of every description. It is also reasonably close to where we are holding the conference and we can arrange to pick you up from there on the Saturday morning.



We will pay for up to two nights accommodation, if needed for your travel connections, for each of your delegates, using the most economical accommodations where possible (i.e., double room with 2 double beds). (A single room costs \$58.50 a night.)

#### CONFERENCE GUIDELINES FOR OUT OF TOWN (DELEGATE) EXPENSES

## TRAVEL

Either car/bus/air/train - depending on distance and cost factor(s), with receipts\*.

Car - submit actual gas bills, with receipts\*.

Local Ground Transportation - \$20. maximum with receipts\*. (e.g. taxi to and from a terminus)

Air - obtain economy air fare; must be cleared by office beforehand.

Train - economy sleeping arrangements (e.g. berth).

## ACCOMMODATION

QFHSA conferences: we arrange stay at nearby motel. If this is not acceptable we will reimburse you at this rate if you choose more expensive accommodations. Advantage of staying in motel of our choice: we will arrange transportation.

## MEALS

Daily allowance, while travelling, \$20./day maximum, with receipts\*.
(We estimate \$5.00 for breakfast; \$5.00-7.00 for lunch; \$8.00-10.00 for dinner.)

Scheduled meals at QFHSA conferences are at your own expense, as per prices marked on registration form. We recommend that local Home & School Associations budget to pay all or major portion of these meal costs, on behalf of their delegates.
