
QUESCREN produced more publications this year than any other since its establishment 16 years ago.

Our growing online and media presence allows us to reach out to English-speaking communities in Quebec as well as to people interested in minority language and related issues. In addition, QUESCREN initiatives were featured in **11 media articles or broadcasts**.

Website

QUESCREN's [website](#) is the central hub for everything we do, with links to all our publications, events, and initiatives. The homepage of our bilingual site—hosted on Concordia's platform—received a significant refresh this past year, with updates to the rest of the site planned for 2025–26. The English site attracted **12,181 visits** (3,234 unique visitors), while the French site saw around **1,600 visits** (380 unique visitors).

Online Databases

QUESCREEN manages four online databases that help users discover resources on English-speaking Quebec.

Brendan O'Donnell's Bibliography on English-speaking Quebec

This [bibliography](#), which Brendan O'Donnell has been compiling since the 1970s, contains secondary sources related to the study of English-speaking Quebec. Resources include everything from scholarly studies to magazine articles, by way of films and websites. This year Brendan **added 110 titles to the bibliography, bringing the total number of entries up to 14,604**. This invaluable resource was **searched 55,968 times by 33,521 unique visitors**. Thanks to Brendan for his decades of volunteer work on this!

Community Knowledge Open Library (CKOL)

The [Community Knowledge Open Library \(CKOL\)](#) is a growing online full-text database listing of grey literature sourced from the province's English-speaking community groups. Grey literature is unpublished but non-archival material made available to the public, such as annual reports, PowerPoints, and pamphlets. So far, **51 community partner organizations** from across Quebec have joined the project. At the end of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, we had catalogued **a total of 4,828 resources**, up from 4,488 the year before.

Data Portal on English-Speaking Quebec (DESQ)

The [Data Portal on English-Speaking Quebec \(DESQ\)](#) is a NEW online database offering custom statistical datasets focused on Quebec's English-speaking population. Created for individual researchers and organizations, the datasets are primarily based on Canadian census data and include information not available on the Statistics Canada website. There are now **150 datasets** on the portal.

ILET Research Hub

The [ILET Research Hub](#) brings together all QUESCREEN-produced research-based resources on Quebec's English-language education ecosystem along with [blog posts](#) and [infographics](#). To enhance user experience, we have made improvements to the website interface for smoother navigation and accessibility. The hub attracted 2,131 views in the past year, including 758 unique visitors.

Memories of Entry Island

On remote Entry Island, just 60 year-round residents—mostly English-speaking descendants of 19th-century shipwrecked Brits—live between sea and sky. People's History of English-Speaking Quebec

This project explores the long and diverse history of English-speaking Quebecers from the 1600s to the present. It highlights the contributions of underrepresented groups—ethnocultural communities, workers, women, and others—throughout the province. By focusing on how these communities organized and engaged in collective action, the project reveals a rich legacy of inclusion, diversity, and debate within English-speaking organizations in Quebec. It also challenges the common narrative that portrays English speakers solely as a wealthy, dominant elite.

While much of the work on this project is still happening behind the scenes, we're excited to share one of its key components: a growing series of [oral history videos](#). These videos will serve as primary source material for an upcoming richly-illustrated history book featuring compelling stories intended for a general audience.
