

## TALQ welcomes Miller to Official portfolio

**MONTREAL, December 1, 2025** – The appointment of Liberal MP Marc Miller as the new Minister of Canadian Identity, Culture and Official Languages is a positive development, TALQ President Eva Ludvig said today.

Miller, MP for Ville-Marie-le Sud-Ouest-Ile des Sœurs, served as Immigration Minister under former prime minister Justin Trudeau, as well as portfolios involving Indigenous relations.

“Mr. Miller has proved himself as a competent minister handling complex files,” Ludvig said. “As a fluently bilingual Quebecer, he is intimately familiar with the currents of language issues in Quebec and across the country.

“We look forward to meeting Mr. Miller in the very near future to discuss our continuing concerns related to language and identity files. Based on our previous experiences, we anticipate this will continue a productive and amicable relationship.”

Miller was appointed to replace Steven Guilbeault, who resigned from cabinet last week. Environment Minister Julie Dabrusin adds Guilbeault’s Nature portfolio to hers, and Procurement Minister Joël Lightbound picks up Guilbeault’s post of Quebec lieutenant.
