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Increasing Visibility by Reaching Out to Elected Officials

When Covid-19 made its way into our lives in late March 2020, REISA's team members began working from home. Perhaps a silver lining to the pandemic was the ease with which REISA was able to organize first encounters (virtual, of course) with 10 MNAs and 4 MPs over a nine-month period. These elected officials represent the 9 boroughs that make up REISA's territory: the East and North parts of Montreal.

REISA was met with motivation, open-mindedness, and a willingness to partner on initiatives supporting the English-speaking minority communities. Officials provided

knowledge and insight on the English speakers in their respective ridings, as well as referral to community groups that offer services to the ESC.

A Helping Hand for Seniors



To combat isolation during the second wave lockdown, REISA helped deliver holiday care packages to members of Almage Senior Community Centre in November and December.



In addition, REISA partnered with the English Montreal School Board and the West End Intergenerational Network (WIN) to distribute over 840 handmade holiday cards to seniors living in NDG and the East and North of Montreal.

REISA would like to thank John Caboto, Pierre Elliot Trudeau, Leonardo Da Vinci and Honoré Mercier Elementary schools for producing over 170 cards for this initiative. We also would like to extend our thanks to the EMSB and WIN for their help in spreading some holiday joy during these difficult times—we're all in this together!

McGill Dialogue

Now more than ever, staying current on the best health practices is vital. In partnership with McGill's Ingram school of Nursing, REISA helped organized virtual health information sessions for various community groups, including parents of the YMCA Saint-Laurent Daycare, teens and young adults of the Don Bosco Youth Leadership Centre, and seniors of the McGill University Centre for Studies in Aging.

Presented by final year nursing students, the information sessions addressed topics such

as COVID for parents, Social Media Mental Health, *Ask Nurse Betty*, and Brainy BOMMER healthy aging.


On January 28th, REISA hosted it's second Youth Network Forum in a virtual format. The forum brought together 14 youth organizations- mostly the Carrefour Jeunesse Emploi located on the REISA territory. We are very pleased by the collaborative effort and dedication of our partners in addressing the challenges of youth employability in the East and North of Montreal.

Legal Workshops

REISA has organized three free, virtual workshops in partnership with the McGill Legal Information Clinic for groups at the McGill Centre for Studies in Aging, the Almage Senior Community Center and the Center for Dreams and Hopes. Furthermore, REISA teamed up with the McGill LEX (Law Education Connexion) Outreach Program to offer legal workshops to high school students. As it stands, two workshops are planned with two high schools in February on the topics of Employment and Labor Laws, and Crimes and Offences.

Mother Goose Program



Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, REISA had to pause Mother Goose sessions at the Rivière-des-Prairies library, though a positive relationship is maintained. REISA continues to develop partnerships in other boroughs including Saint-Leonard and Saint-Laurent, in order to bring the program to multiple communities once restrictions are lifted. REISA will be training three additional animators in the spring of 2021 so as to serve the growing need.

Islands of Friends

Every year, children must embark on the formative transition from Pre-K to elementary school. To help ease this transition and help children cope with these changes, REISA, in partnership with Agence OMETZ, implemented a transition program in two prekindergarten classes at Nesbitt Elementary School and Gerald McShane Elementary School. The program consisted of a series of four different workshops that focused on personal space, whole body listening, emotion recognition, and emotional regulation. The program was very well received and REISA aims to work with several other elementary schools in the East and North of Montreal.

REISA has spent the past year making several changes and updates to our official webpage, including the addition of a new Resource Database. Follow the link below to search for health and social services by borough, category, or both!


