Early Childhood Development

The main goal of the project is to identify the resources, programs, services, and needs within each community on the Lower North Shore in regards to youth aged 0-5. In order to reach this goal, a survey has been developed for the input of the regional organizations/institutions. Also, a brief phone survey will be conducted with the parents (with children 0-5) from mid-November to mid-December. This survey is designed to find out the needs of the parents in each community. Through this initiative we aspire to improve the well-being of our children (ages 0-5), and your involvement would enable us to ensure the creation of a longterm implementation plan. Health Matters

Quebec En Forme



In September 2008, Québec en Forme granted the Lower North Coalition for Health Shore (LNSCH) a start-up project to hire a mobilization agent. The project proposed by the Lower North Shore Coalition for Health was in line with the priorities of Québec en Forme to support the mobilization of communities and to promote and encourage a healthy active lifestyle for youth ages 0-17. In collaboration with Québec en Forme, the Lower North Shore Coalition for Health has targeted two municipalities as part of a pilot project for the region of the

Lower North Shore. The municipalities targeted are Bonne Espérance and Côte-Nord du Golfe St-Laurent. The implication of regional organizations and local action groups that support healthy eating and/or physical activity for youth will be essential for the success of the pilot project. The Lower North Shore is already «on the move» and has many programs and activities that encourage a healthy active lifestyle for youth in the region. The introduction of the

«Healthy Schools» approach in a number of schools, a nutrition policy developed for the schools, many extra-curricular sports and activities, the annual Terry Fox Run and KIDS summer camp are only a few examples of the on-going initiatives in our region. It is expected that a partnership with Québec en Forme will compliment these programs and activities and ensure the vision of creating a favourable environment for youth to be healthy and active in all villages of the Lower North Shore. The Networking Partnership Initiative project was approved for another year in April 2008, and many activities have been carried out since then. Multiple meetings were held from April to September, in preparation for the Quebec En Forme project submission. Meetings were also held with CHSSSN and members of other provincial groups to discuss the NPI program and other potential programs. The Strategic plan and Sustainability

Wildberry

The wildberry steering committee, Cornella Maurice, Priscilla Griffin, Kimberly Buffitt, Hugh Maynard and the team at Centre d'expertise sur les produits agroforestiers (CEPAF), developed a business plan and forwarded to Ministere des Affaires municipals et des Regions (MAMER), under the rural laboratories program, for a six (6) year project to develop the wildberry industry. Telehealth

The telehealth programming project will continue in the new fiscal year 2008/2009. Several conference calls were held with the CHSSN to plan for this fiscal year. The telehealth sessions being offered this year are as follows (dates to be announced): Fall Prevention, Trauma, Nutrition, When they go away to work: separation anxiety, Eye Disease, Kidneys, Bladder & Incontinence, Medications and Care-giving: At Home and in Institutions. A training session regarding the facilitation of groups was held in September, 2008. A request was made to CHSSN for additional video-conferencing equipment to aid in the implementation of telehealth. CHSSN responded that they had four sets of equipment available (i.e.: video-conferencing network equipment, cart & 52" TV, at value of \$25,000 per set – total of \$75,000), but could not pay the installation fees, CSL agreed to pay all installation fees and it was decided that the location of the sites (4 schools) would be Kegaska, Harrington Harbour, St. Augustine and Blanc Sablon. McGill Retention

The December 2007 special project, which included the development of community maps, Centre de Santé et des services Sociaux de la Basse Cote Nord guidebook and CSSSBCN website, was completed in March 2008 with a short report produced. The new CSSSBCN website can be found at www.csssbcn.gouv.qc.ca. The McGill Retention program was extended in April 2008 for an additional year. An application was also made for three summer intern positions from McGill, but did not take place due to unavailability of students. The annual McGill information sharing meeting took place on September 25th and 26th in Montreal and was attended by two representatives from the Coasters Association and one from the CSSSBCN. The CSSSBCN Lodging Database has been drafted and is scheduled for completion by March 2009. The development of the lodging database is ongoing and can include house or apartment rental, or even room rental. This database will not be used for public distribution and it does not guarantee your accommodations will be used. LEAP

Trina Roberts from St. Paul's River and Marie Anderson from Chevery were hired from September 22nd, 2008 to February 6th, 2009 (20 weeks) through funding from the Carleton University to carry out the LEAP program (Local Employability Access Program). This

program is an initiative of the CLC's (Chevery and St. Paul's River), in partnership with the Coasters Association and the Municipality of Golfe St. Laurent. The program was launched by representatives from Carleton University, at the CLC's in Chevery and St. Paul's

Diabetes Intervention Strategy

Through the Diabetes Intervention Strategy, two video cameras were purchased for St. Paul's High School and Netagamiou School in Chevery for students to produce diabetes prevention videos. Clips of students were produced and will be placed on DVD's to be used on Phase II. This information will be used to aid in the promotion and prevention of diabetes in our communities. The second phase project from the Canadian Italian

Community Public Health Strategy

River on September 30th, 2008. This program targets adults who are interested in developing their personal and\or professional skills through a coaching/mentorship framework offered through video-conferencing. Training is ongoing from October 21st to December 12th,

A special CPHS project has been submitted to animate and promote the 5-30 program in all of the high schools across the Lower North Shore.
