• Mentoring a professional: a mutually rewarding experience!

People who participate in MCLL have wide-ranging career experience, from technical and scientific professions and trades, to education, arts and culture, to business and government administration. The varied knowledge, experience and network of contacts of many MCLL members positions them to be valued mentors to adults, often recent immigrants, who face obstacles in finding a job that enables


them to fully use their skills and expertise.

McGill's School of Continuing Studies—of which MCLL is part—has launched the **Experiential and Empowerment Development (SEED) Initiative** to help increase access to professional education and career advancement. In collaboration with community and industry partners, 40 to 50 individuals are selected each year as SEED Fellows to complete a Professional Development Certificate (PDC) in Collaboration & Productivity, improve their proficiency in French, and obtain a professional certification of their choice (e.g., MS Excel, QuickBooks Online, etc.).

The SEED Initiative enables participants to develop or enhance in-demand professional skills, improve French language proficiency, gain practical experience, and establish professional networks. SEED Fellows are professionals or aspiring professionals ready to advance their career, but who face systemic barriers to professional education and/or opportunity. They could benefit from the knowledgeable help and life experiences that a good mentor can provide, and the opportunity to discuss their goals, challenges and professional experiences.

What is the Fiat Lux Project?

The Fiat Lux Project is the transformation of the McLennan-Redpath Library complex into a new library filled with service and space offerings for the digital era to better respond to the needs of McGill students. Construction is currently anticipated to begin in 2025 and will take an estimated two to three years to complete. The McLennan-Redpath Library complex will be unavailable throughout the construction process.

What is the McGill University Collections Centre?

A sizable portion of the book collection is currently being relocated to the new McGill University Collections Centre. The move is proceeding one floor at a time, with unaffected floors staying open (and stacks accessible) until it's their turn. Books moving to the Collections Centre will be unavailable until it opens (March - April 2024). The "Request/ Hold" button for items on the move will not appear in the catalogue, but the hold button to borrow from other Quebec libraries (Network Loans) will remain.

What are Network Loans?

MCLL members can now borrow physical items belonging to 17 other Quebec university libraries through the library catalogue (Sofia). Requested items will be delivered to a McGill branch library of your choice for pickup.


