- Lingwick Protestant Cemetery Company fonds (P251). New acquisition. – 1908-2020. – 0.44 l.m. of textual records.

This new acquisition expands on the single textual record that the ETRC already held for this organization. Previously, we only had [one financial statement](#) dating from 2007 to attest to the activities of the LPCC; now, the ETRC has over 100 years' worth of its history.

- Wales Home Masonic Lodge of Instruction U.D., Freemasons (Richmond) fonds (P273). New acquisition. – 1990-2021. – 0.21 l.m. of textual records.

This new fonds adds to the ETRC's growing repository of records relating to Freemasons' lodges in the Eastern Townships. A large processing project, during the summer of 2023, made several of our Freemasons' fonds accessible for researchers. Through the dedicated work of our Archives Department, we hope to make these new records accessible to the public very soon.
