Welcome to the end of another jam-packed year of action on behalf of the Eastern Townships Englishspeaking community! This annual report offers highlights of some of the many ways the team at Townshippers' have been working hard on your behalf along with some of the accomplishments that we celebrated this past year. I hope it will leave you with a sense of what the organization stands for and how we interpret and accomplish our mission.

Our focus throughout 2017-2018 prioritized the needs and issues signaled to us as of the utmost importance when we reached out for feedback during our strategic planning exercise: youth employment and retention; access to services in English; support for our educational institutions.

Thanks to our strong networks, collaborations with partners across sectors and investments from new sources in our minority language community, our existing programs have evolved and grown, and our pilot programs are achieving beyond their goals.

This year we paid tribute to community leadership - established and emerging - through our Outstanding Townshippers and Young Townships Leaders Awards. We gave high schoolers a platform to express their truths as young English speakers with the Excel in the Estrie contest and encouraged them to plan and dream for the future through the Rooted in the Townships Skills Development project. Our Eastern Townships Partners for Health and Social Services networks handed out \$20,000 in bursaries to health and social services students with English and French language skills through the McGill Health and Social Services Community Leadership Bursary Program. As always, we benefitted from the energy and enthusiasm of two university students who were able to join our team as part of the Young Canada Works in Both Official Languages program.

Finally, I am most pleased that we were able to bring together two important regional partners who are as enthusiastic and dedicated to creating a sustainable fall festival as we are. The Eastern Townships School Board and the CIUSSS de l'Estrie - CHUS are keen to work with our staff and volunteers to ensure that Townshippers' Festival is a resounding success. The 2018 theme "Everybody's a Townshipper" captures the organizing committee's hope that our celebration of the Eastern Townships Englishspeaking community becomes one that all those who call the Eastern Townships home will see a place for themselves in and bring people together in a fun family-friendly environment. I hope to see you all there with us in Richmond next September, it's going to be a blast!


