



CONFERENCE GUIDELINES FOR OUT OF TOWN (DELEGATE) EXPENSES

TRAVEL

Either car/bus/air/train - depending on distance and cost factor(s), with receipts*.

Car: We allow 12¢/km within 100 km radius of Montreal.

Beyond 100 km radius, actual gas bills, with receipts*.

Local Ground Transportation: \$20. maximum with receipts* (ex. if a taxi

is necessary to/from a terminus).

Air: Air travel must be cleared by office beforehand.

<u>Train</u>: Economy sleeping arrangements (e.g. berth).

ACCOMMODATION

We will arrange to billet you with some friendly Home & Schoolers. Advantage of staying in a Home & Schooler's home is that they will arrange for you to get to the conference site.

MEALS

Daily allowance, while travelling, \$30./day maximum, with receipts*. (We are estimating \$5 for breakfast, \$10 for lunch; \$15 for dinner. Wine and alcoholic beverages excluded.)
