



A Word from an ETRC Intern

Hi, I'm Andrée and I am this semester's digitization intern! Twice a week I come to the ETRC to work on digitizing the Archives' accession records prior to the early 2000s. Accession records are the preliminary records about an item when they are first brought to the Archives Department. They tell us, broadly, what the item is, the condition, who donated it, and where it will go once sorted. When digitizing these records I have to make sure that our current records match what is in the original accessions. This involves a lot of cross-referencing and perusing the stacks to find the location of many of these documents. The most satisfying parts of this internship are solving archival mysteries and working in such a lovely team.



The donation includes an original diary that Alan Albright and Jane Jenson of the SHCO used in their 2023 publication, <u>A Year in the Life of Cherry River: John Buzzell</u>, 1916-1917

Doris Snowdon fonds (P138). New accrual. – [1910?]-[ca. 2010]. – 52 photographs: b&w. – 2 postcards: b&w. – 2 textual records. – 1 film reel (00:24:33).

This accrual underscores the importance of Sally's Pond, near Knowlton, for former Montreal-based artist, Doris Snowdon. The artist's idyllic sketches of her family's cottage are now accompanied by home movies and photographs showing the Snowdon family enjoying the leisure afforded by Townships cottage life.

 Melbourne Ridge United Church fonds (UC075). New accrual. – 1857-[200-?]. – 0.01 l.m. of textual records. United Churches in the Eastern Townships area. Up until this deposit, we only had photocopies of the Melbourne Ridge United Church's oldest minute books. Thanks to this accrual, we were able to replace the photocopies with the original books, which covered a longer time period than the photocopies.
