### CATEGORY 1 BURSARY

#### Purpose

Provide financial incentive to students from selected Quebec regions (see below on right) with appropriate English and French language skills, pursuing full-time studies in the area of health and social services **outside their region**, in a government recognized educational institution.

#### Bursary Total Amounts for Academic Year 2018-2019

The Program will allocate a total of \$200,000 in bursaries for the academic year 2018-2019.

#### Bursary Amounts for Category 1

- University: \$10,000 per student
- Cegep/college: \$5,000 per student

#### Category 1 Bursary Recipient Commitment

For each bursary awarded, category 1 bursary recipients must commit to returning to one of the selected Quebec region following successful completion of studies to work for a minimum of one year in a public health and social services institution or related organization.
