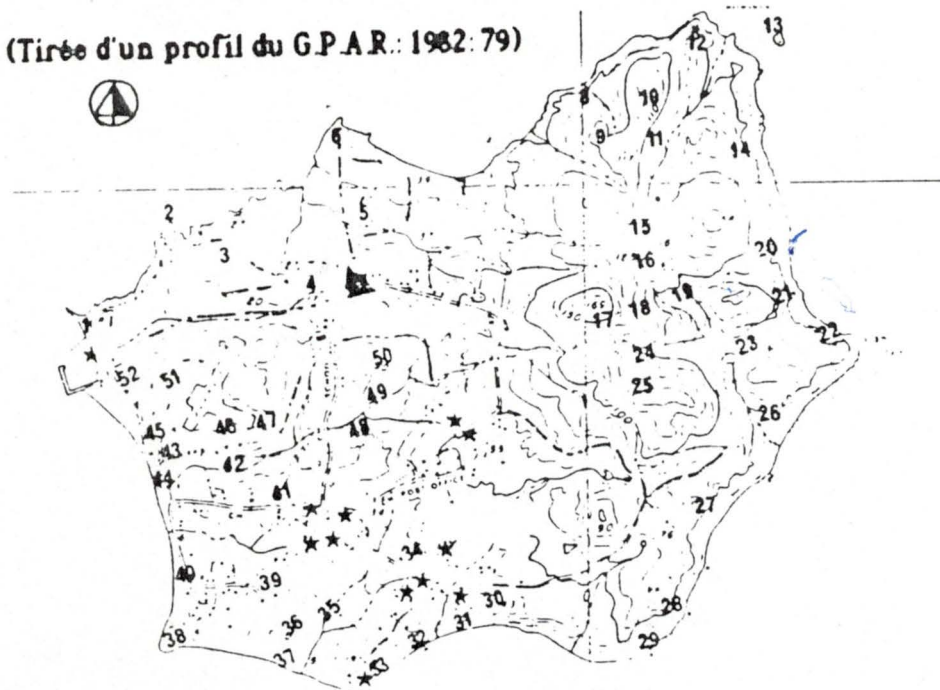


- 1) North Point -----It is located at the north side of the island.
- 2) Islands -----Pieces of rock that were out clear of the bank and they looked like little islands.
- 3) Point Hill -----A hill that was near the point where they hauled their boats up every evening.
- 4) Max Marsh
- 5) Cart Wheel Hollow -----The spot where old cartwheels from wagons were put when they were broken.
- 6) Shag Point-----This is the spot where many shags nest.
- 7) Seal Beach-----A lot of seal came ashore in this spot during the spring.
- 8) Red & Black-----This bank is half-red and half-black with a split in the middle.
- 9) Jim's Hill
- 10) Fox Hole ----- Foxes have their dens in this area.
- 11) Mosey's Hollow ----- A man named Mosey lived alone in this place with his dog. One day he disappeared never to be seen again. The only thing that was found was his dog & gun.
- 12) Black Head ----- The rim around the top of the cape is black, that is why it is called Black Head.
- 13) Jackie's Rock-----According to legend, Jacques Cartier's ship hit this rock in 1534, during his voyage.
- 14) Pig Hill-----This was a pasture area for the farmer's pigs. One time there were a lot of trees on this hill.
- 15) Big Hill-----It is the largest hill in the Magdalen Islands with a summit of 580 feet above sea level.
- 16) Joe's Hill----- Property was believed to be owned by Joseph Turnbull in the 1840's.
- 17) Henry's Hill----- This property belonged to Henry Welsh.
- 18) Pete's Hill----- -Property owned by Peter Turnbull
- 19) Joe's Hollow-----Property was believed to be owned by Joseph Turnbull in the 1840's.
- 20) Parkey's Point
- 21) No Bottom Pond-----The pond got its name because you can't see the bottom of it or hear a rock hit the bottom of it.
- 22) Devil's Island-----A piece of land shaped like a devil's head.
- 23) Kitty's Brook-----A little girl named Kitty was buried in this spot.
- 24) Pete's Field-----Property owned by Peter Turnbull.
- 25) Wash Pond-----Women gathered here to wash wool and clothes in this pond instead of carrying the water home.
- 26) John Dickson's Hill-----The property belonged to John Dickson.
- 27) Old Lighthouse-----The first lighthouse was moved here from the top of the Wash Pond.
- 28) Old Man Old Woman----The rocks that fell from the banks were shaped like an old man and old woman.
- 29) Clover Hill-----A lot of clover grew on this hill.
- 30) Plaster Hill-----People made plaster from the sand in this bank. They used it to make and fix things.
- 31) SandBank-----This spot contained a lot of fine beach sand. It was used to build things such as chimneys.
- 32) Aunt Jane's Brook-----This spot was named after a lady who lived near the brook. Her name was Jane Dickson Collins.
- 33) Ocher Hill-----This hill had a lot of ocher in it. It was used to make paint in the olden days.
- 34) Cassidy's Hill-----The property belonged to the Cassidy's.
- 35) Frank's Hill-----Property owned by Frank Dickson.
- 36) Frank's Pond-----Property owned by Frank Dickson.
- 37) Low Place-----Down near the water edge where the land is low.
- 38) Southwest Point-----Located on the southwest part of the Island.
- 39) Jock's Field-----Property owned by John McLean.
- 40) James's----- -Location of first wharf on Entry Island. Wharf owned by Frank Leslie. Land owned by James Dickson.
- 41) Church Hill-----Hill that both churches were built on.
- 42) Patton's Pond-----The property around the pond belonged to the Pattons.
- 43) McLedd's Lobster Factory-
- 44) Fish House-----This is where a few bait houses were located and boats were hauled up on the beach there.
- 45) Red Hill-----This hill was full of red sand. (What is known today as Point Hill.)
- 46) Patton's Hill-----Property owned by the Pattons.
- 47) Old Grave Yard-----This is where the first grave yard was located in the late 1800's and early 1900's.
- 48) Old School House-----It was the third school built on the Island, and it was destroyed by fire in 1962.
- 49) Siggs Hill-----Property owned by a man name John Sigsworth in the mid 1800's
- 50) Bushey's -----Property was believed to be owned by a man named Joseph Bouchey in the late 1800's.
