What Is An Artist's Bio?

- A text that introduces the person behind the artwork
- Often accompanies your CV and artist statement
 - DIFFERS from a CV written in prose, gives more context
 - DIFFERS from an artist statement includes details of your life, doesn't go into much depth about artwork

Content: Personal

- Convey who you are and what you've done
- Only include events relevant to your development as an artist
- Don't just copy your CV
- Mention your ideas and inspirations
- Be honest, authentic and unpretentious

Content: Practical

- ____
- Narrative-style (usually from past-present)
- Third-person prose
- Keep sentences short and simple
- Length varies adhere to specific requirements
- Tone:
 - Clear and professional
 - Reflect the tone of the artwork

AVOID

- Passive voice

 - See Kapwani Kiwanga won the 2018 Sobey Art Award.
- Exaggerations
 - "the best"
 - o "amazing"
- Artspeak or complicated language
 - "IAE rebukes English for its lack of nouns: Visual becomes visuality, global becomes globality, potential becomes potentiality, experience becomes ... <u>experiencability</u>" (Rule and Levine, 2012)

Best Practice

- Proofread and peer edit before you submit
- Keep a digital file of your art writing
- Research specific requirements and adapt your bio accordingly
 - Work from a COPY (don't overwrite or delete)
 - Save different versions of your bio for future use
