2020 Flu Vaccination

This year the influenza vaccine for the seasonal flu is being offered in our region, however, it may be organized differently due to the ongoing pandemic. You will need an appointment to get the flu vaccine this year. The spots in the individual municipalities are FULL.

If you live in a residence or are in the hospital or are followed regularly by your CLSC:

• please check with the health team around you as they will be organizing appointments to distribute the vaccine.

As of Monday October 19, in the territory of Chaudière Appalaches:

- you will be able to book an appointment online at <u>www.monvaccin.ca</u>; OR
- call 1-855-480-8094, Monday-Friday 08:00-12:00 and 1:00-4:00 pm

Procedure for booking an appointment for the flu vaccine online:

- Go to <u>www.monvaccin.ca</u>
- Click on upper right-hand corner for English
- Click in the box indicated "Choose a Service"
- Click "Seasonal Flu Vaccine"
- Click "Choose This Service"
- Click in the box "Postal Code" and write your postal code in
- Click "Search". It should then give you a list of places where you can obtain an appointment for the vaccine.

The flu vaccine is free for the following people:

- People with a chronic illness, for example, diabetes, problems with the immune system, lung or heart problems, kidney disease.
- 75 years old or older; healthy children 6-23 months old; healthy people from 60-74 yrs.
- Pregnant women in the 2nd or 3rd trimester
- People who are at risk of transmitting the virus to a susceptible person who is at high risk of complications: for example if you are living under the same roof, if you are a caregiver, and /or living with an infant less than 6 months old.
- A health care worker working with people who are at high risk of complications.

Visiting People Nearing the End of Their Life: The Rules Have Been Loosened

Multiple visitors allowed

Partners and children of patient's receiving palliative care or who are nearing the end of life can visit at the same time. There is no maximum number at one time. Other important people in the patient's life can visit two at a time. If the visitor is a child, they must be accompanied by an adult. Volunteers will also be allowed in palliative care homes. In day centres, one caregiver can accompany a patient who is in palliative care and is nearing the end of life.
