Supporting and Capacity-Building

Literacy Quebec continued to provide support to its members by offering training and assistance via web, email and telephone. Members were brought together once in person and once via conference call for professional development and networking opportunities.

Through a PACTE funded project, Literacy Quebec was able to develop tools to strengthen its network. The project allowed us to examine new ways of promoting literacy and explaining the issues surrounding low literacy to the general public. The project also enabled the organization to engage more volunteers and pilot a database to track volunteers, supporters, members, etc.

Freda Hudson Award

The Freda Hudson award was inaugurated in 2007 in honour of a remarkable volunteer. It is presented annually to an active and longstanding volunteer, someone who has made a significant contribution to Literacy.

The recipient of this year's Freda Hudson award was Warren Law of The Learning Exchange. Student Solidarity Fund




Online Presence

Our Social Media presence continued to grow steadily this year with 45 new followers on Facebook, and 118 new followers on Twitter.



The use of online campaigns has proven to be a successful way of raising awareness about literacy issues and the work being done in the field. One campaign that was especially successful was the #WomenInLiteracy campaign. Most of the literacy groups we represent are run by women, so for International Women's Day we decided to share and celebrate the stories of these women.





Our Instagram account has been significantly more active this year. Thanks to our social media interns, we have grown to have 117 followers, and almost 600 post likes on that platform alone.

Two new videos have been added to our YouTube account this year. With almost 500 views, this seems to be an effective way to demonstrate the struggles faced by adults with low literacy.

Events & Special Projects

Literacy Quebec began participating in more community events this year. Our involvement in these events has allowed us to raise awareness about the cause, promote the work being done by the literacy groups we represent, and recruit new volunteers.

Promoting Family Literacy in the Community

This year LQ received funding through the Silver Dollar Foundation to develop a Family Literacy Toolkit. This toolkit is essentially a "How-To" manual for community groups who wish to host a family literacy event.

Through this project we were able to reach 1500 people through Family Literacy events, and provide information to 40 community groups.

Volunteer Positions & Internship Opportunities

Volunteers continue to be essential to the work being done in the field. This year Literacy Quebec was lucky to have a team of 30 amazing volunteers who gave 1395 hours to the organization. Our partnership with the Public Relations program of Concordia University has been especially key in the recruitment of passionate volunteer interns.

Funding received through the Canada Summer Jobs program has allowed Literacy Quebec to offer full time summer employment opportunities for students.

Literacy Quebec would like to thank all of the amazing volunteers who go above and beyond what is expected of them. We couldn't do it without your help and dedication to the cause. In particular we would like to acknowledge the contributions of our volunteers who were involved on our Board of Directors, our Committees, and our Internship Programs.




