PROGRAM SUMMARIES

MCDC offers diverse programs and services for the English-speaking population of Chaudière-Appalaches and l'Érable with a focus on health promotion, mental health, caregivers and community animation for all age groups.



Networking & Partnership Initiative

This program is designed to support the English-speaking community in improving and maintaining access to Health and Social Services. MCDC maintains a strong relationship with the Centre Intégré de Santé et de Services Sociaux de Chaudière-Appalaches (CISSS-CA) to improve services. We offer information and referral services to other community organizations.



Services to Seniors & Caregivers

Through our Senior Wellness Centres, MCDC offers a wide variety of activities to promote a healthy lifestyle, physical and cognitive stimulation, caregiver, and volunteer services to help reduce social isolation.



Youth & Families

MCDC has built a strong partnership with the English-speaking schools in its territory and offers students diverse activities to develop life skills, promote volunteering and connect with community organizations. We support parents and the kindergarten students by preparing school readiness kits to develop and reinforce critical skills in early childhood.



Community Life

Social activities such as the Meet & Greet play an important role in our English-speaking communities and our community library is worth a visit.



Social & Economic Development

MCDC collaborates with partners in employment, tourism, and economic development sectors so that the English-speaking community can contribute to the development of the entire region. Partnership building with French-speaking stakeholders so that they can take into consideration the needs and priorities of our community is vital and important to MCDC.

NETWORKING AND PARTNERSHIP INITIATIVE

NPI PROGRAM SUMMARY

MCDC currently sits on **15** committees/tables to represent the English-speaking community on issues related to health and social services.

We provide knowledge-based evidence to our public and community partners so that they can improve their understanding of the English-speaking community. Our objective is to guide decision-makers when developing programs and services so that the needs and priorities of our members are taken into consideration.

HEALTH PROGRAM SUMMARY

In the COVID context, MCDC offered a combination of virtual and face-to-face sessions. Even though it was challenging to adapt to the situation, our health team delivered high quality programming.

New this year, MCDC received three-year funding from the Secrétariat aux relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise (SRQEA) to offer health promotion activities to our seniors. This new funding will support our existing programs and help to develop new initiatives.

We have also increased our collaborations with our public health partners by participating in different meetings across the region to address many issues impacting the English-speaking community.

Senior Wellness Centers

- 36 sessions, 295 participants.
- Types of sessions: A walking group, garden tours, health information sessions, brain games and trivia, art therapy, a fall and injury prevention program, a mental health and wellness program, exercise classes and a nature documentary.

Regional Access Committee

Community volunteers and MCDC staff participated in two meetings this year and are providing guidance to the Centre Intégré de Santé et de Services Sociaux-Chaudière Appalaches (CISSS-CA) in the delivery of services to the English-speaking community of Chaudière-Appalaches.

Translations for the CISSS

12 documents translated from French to English for the CISSS-CA in 2021-2022.

SENIORS & CAREGIVER PROGRAM SUMMARY

Our health team offered diverse activities, ranging from art therapy, caregiver workshops with an occupational therapist and information sessions. We were also very active in supporting our members with making appointments for the COVID-19 vaccines and assisting them with the vaccination passport.

Caregiver workshops and support group with Jenni Potter, Occupational Therapist, **8** sessions and a total of **8** participants per session.

Community Health Education Program (CHEP) 10 sessions with a total of 46 participants.

33 Drop-in afternoons,3 special editions, 400 participants during the year.

YOUTH & FAMILIES PROGRAM SUMMARY

It was a very busy year for our youth and family programming with two new programs. Thanks to the financial support of the Fondation Lucie & André Chagnon, the Bright Beginnings program will help MCDC with new and adapted services to support English-speaking children and families.

The last two years proved to be very challenging mentally and emotionally for all ages and our youth have been greatly impacted. The Secrétariat à la jeunesse and Fondation Lucie & André Chagnon are providing financial support to MCDC to develop initiatives to support youth mental health.

ENHANCING REGIONAL COMMUNITY CAPACITY

With the financial support of the Secrétariat aux relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise (SRQEA), MCDC has been very busy this year meeting with local stakeholders and service providers to increase awareness of the English-speaking community in Chaudière-Appalaches.

Along with numerous meetings, we also took time to increase our internal capacity to function as an organization by updating our by-laws, updating our Board manual, updated our Employee Handbook and Human Resources policies and developed a compensation policy and updated our pay scales. Our staff received training on social media and Microsoft TEAMS.

This program has allowed MCDC to expand into new sectors or strengthen its presence in existing sectors. We are increasing our presence in the employability and family sectors and have recently expanded into the tourism sector.

Tourism initiative

MCDC in collaboration with the Société de développement économique de la région de Thetford, Tourisme région Thetford, Minéro, and the Société des Archives is developing an initiative to highlight the contribution of the English-speaking community to the development of Thetford Mines area.







SATELLITE OFFICE IN LEVIS

With 63% of the total English-speaking community in Chaudière-Appalaches, it was an underserved area with very little or no services available in English. With this new office, MCDC now has the capacity to better support members of the English-speaking community that could not benefit from services from our head office in Thetford Mines.

The development of our Levis office is going very well and community members have demonstrated their support by taking part in our activities:

23 activities.
532 people reached.
11 newsletters.
9 joint activities with Voice of English-speaking Quebec (VEQ).
2 activities with the MCDC office.
1 interview with CBC radio.

We have also been very busy to build bridges with other English-speaking community organizations in the Quebec City area and have taken part in many meetings and have been sharing best practices. The future looks very promising in Levis, and we are working very hard to also offer joint activities with our head office in Thetford Mines.






