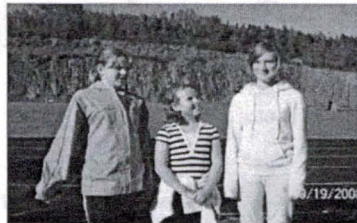
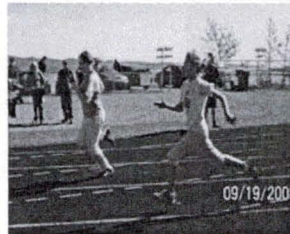


Project Love is an organization which helps third world countries in need of help. 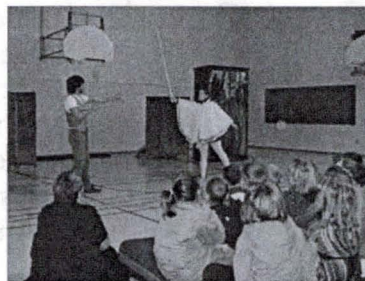
Track & Field

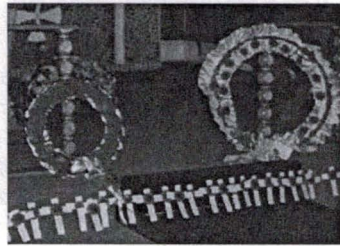
Geordie Production

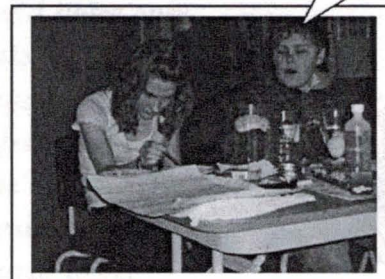
Science Fair

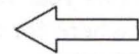
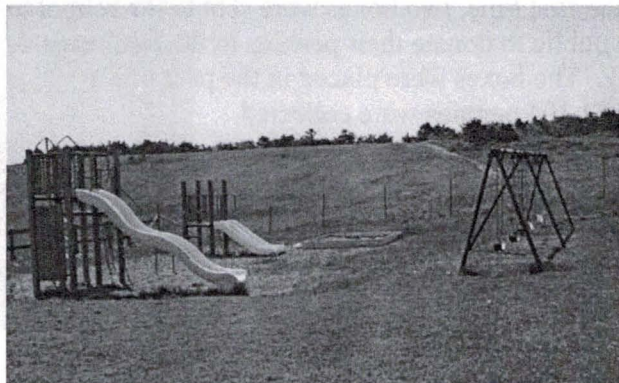
❖ Jump Rope for Heart

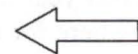
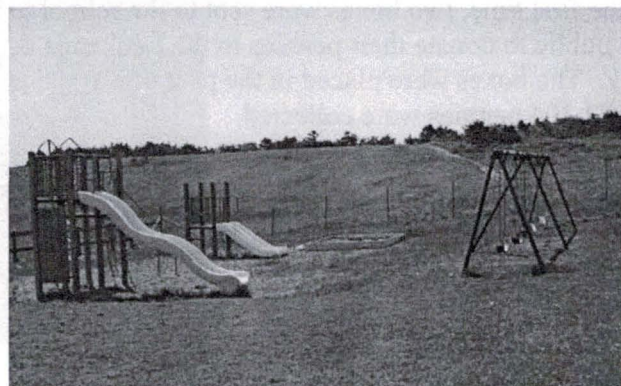
❖ Jump Rope for Heart

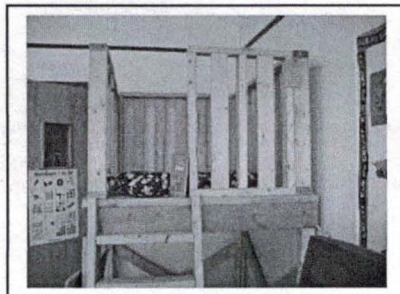
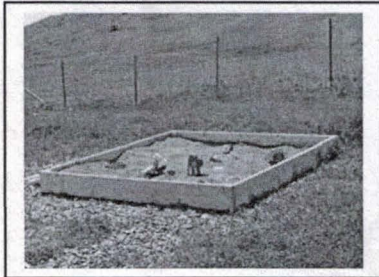
Acknowledgements

First of all, I would like to thank everyone who participated by sending us their recipes or helped in anyway with this 2008-2009 School Yearbook - Community Recipes book.

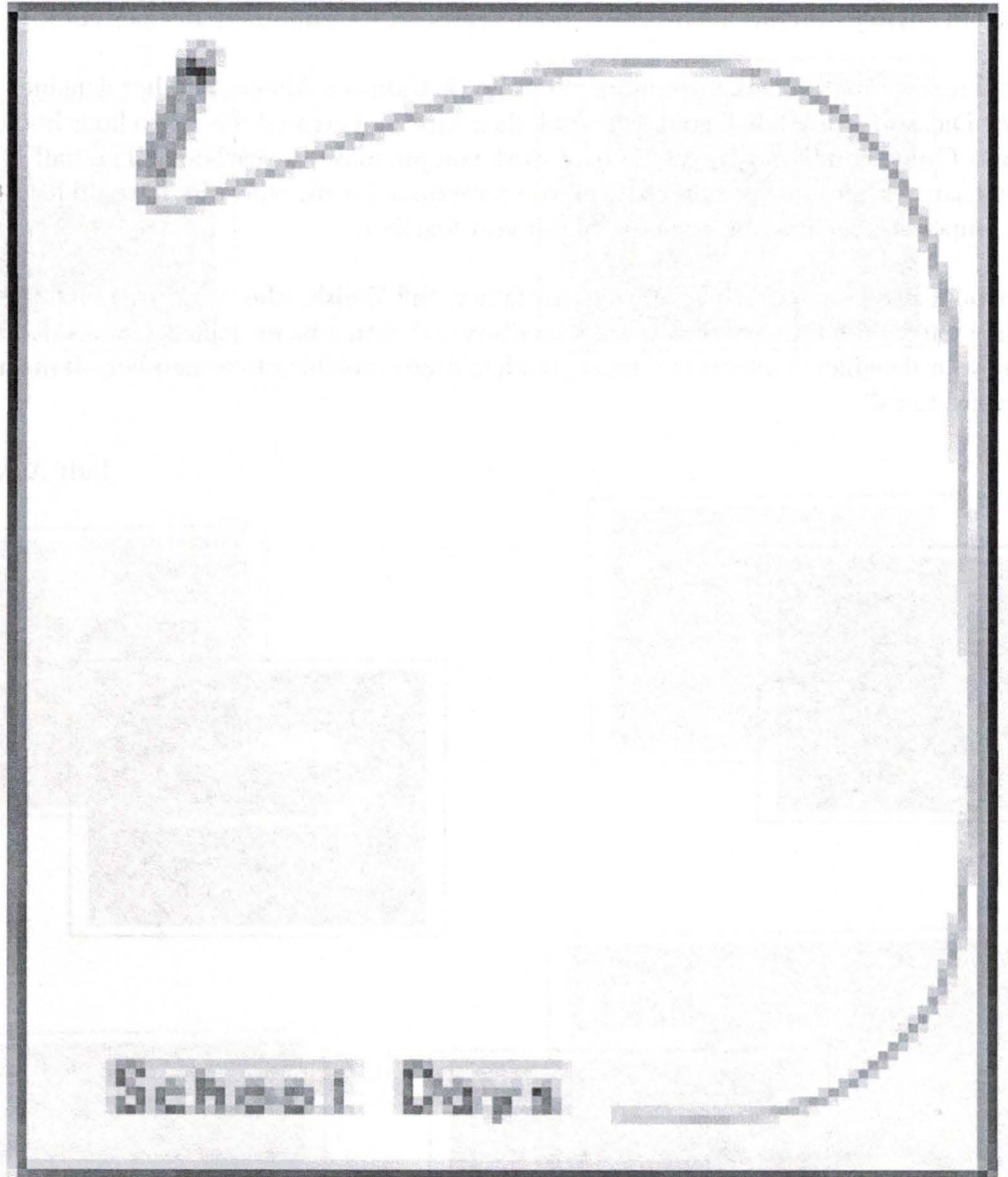
