

DEADLINE for Accommodation Request - September 30, 2006

TRAVEL - Either car/bus/air/train - use the most economical means available.
NO REIMBURSEMENTS WITHOUT ORIGINAL RECEIPTS

- CAR Allowance 30¢/km or actual gas receipts, whichever is the lesser amount.
- Local Ground Transportation: \$30. max. with receipts, e.g. taxi/bus to or from terminus.
- AirTravel: Must be authorized by QFHSA office beforehand. Fax/Call (see below).
- Train: Includes economy sleeping arrangements, e.g. berth.

Please make air/train reservations at least three (3) weeks in advance to obtain best rates.

<u>ACCOMMODATION</u> - QFHSA will arrange billets with friendly Home & Schoolers. (see Request Form overside) if possible, or in a nearby Motel/Hotel at our expense.

MEALS (while travelling) - Daily allowance - \$45 maximum, with receipts.

Breakfast - up to \$8; Lunch - up to \$13; Dinner - up to \$24. Wine and alcoholic beverages excluded.
