Introduction

Living in such an isolated area such as, the Lower North Shore, there is a lack of activities for all ages, but more so for the adolescent age. There are very few activities on the Lower North Shore that directly focuses on teenagers, so teens resort to other activities that result in social problems (i.e. drinking, drugs, vandalism, etc...). Therefore, a French Immersion Teen Camp would provide teenagers with activities and a program that is especially designed for them. Teenagers could have a chance to get away from the social problems and into a program that will nurture and develop a safe and healthy environment in which the teens can improve their health and obtain skills that will assist them in their future lives and also promote and develop their French as a Second Language skill.

There was a feasibility study conducted to help determine the interest and attainability of potentially implementing this camp via research and surveys. There were 2008 surveys sent to the population, 32 sent to the regional organizations and 71 to the community groups/businesses in the Francophone communities. The outcome of these surveys can be found in Section II and copies of the surveys can be found in the annexes. The results of the surveys were utilized to determine the needs, interest, a list of priorities and in which community (La Romaine, Tête-à-la Baleine or Lourdes de Blanc Sablon) the camp will be established. An action plan has been developed for the program and a training program, an operational manual, and a day camp first aid guide were developed for the second phase of the project and are included in the package.

During the summer of 2008, there were partnerships formed (i.e. steering committee, resource partners) to assist in the planning and implementation of the Teen Summer Camp. Research has also been carried out on funding possibilities that could be available for the long term sustainability of the teen camp and various French Immersion programs as well.

The French Immersion Teen Camp is vital to the improvement of the overall well being of the teenagers on the Lower North Shore. It will provide numerous opportunities for them to explore and develop many skills for their future endeavors through a variety of activities, sports and language development.




Regional Organizations



Future Planning

Next Steps

Due to the deficit in French as a second language among the youth, our goal now is to implement a French Immersion Teen Camp to promote the development of programming teens, through a French Immersion environment that will lead to the improvement of their physical and mental well being, artistic growth, environmental awareness and promote language development. While the possibility of establishing a French Immersion Teen Camp is being researched, funding is also required to ensure the implementation and continuation of the camp in 2009.

Recommendations:

- Employ a full-time coordinator to continue the French Immersion Teen Camp initiative
- Determine the location of the camp (in a French community)
- Determine if selected community has required infrastructures available
- Meeting with stakeholders
- Submit an application to the Forum Jeunesse Côte Nord for funding
- Form a committee in the selected community to operate the camp on a day-to-day basis
- Plan and Prepare for the implementation of the French Immersion Teen Camp in 2009 (if funding is obtained)
- Get seniors to be involved in services (i.e. expertise)
- Population survey conducted at random via telephone
- Conduct surveys at different time of the year

Conclusion

Since we live in a very isolated area, it is a challenge to find new and exciting activities to interest the youth. We do not have the same amenities as a larger community, therefore we must be creative and imaginative in creating a place where the teenagers can interact with other teens, learn about themselves, develop their skills and just have fun.

Unfortunately we have received a very low response ratio to the surveys that were dispersed to the population and community organizations/businesses due to the fact that the majority of the population on the Lower North Shore is away during the summer months in order to find employment. Therefore a follow-up survey via telephone should be conducted during the upcoming fall and winter season.

Based upon the results of the surveys, there was a tie between Tête-à-la Baleine and Lourdes de Blanc Sablon for the recommended camp location, and Lourdes de Blanc Sablon was the recommended community which is better equipped in terms of infrastructures, soccer fields, baseball fields, etc.
