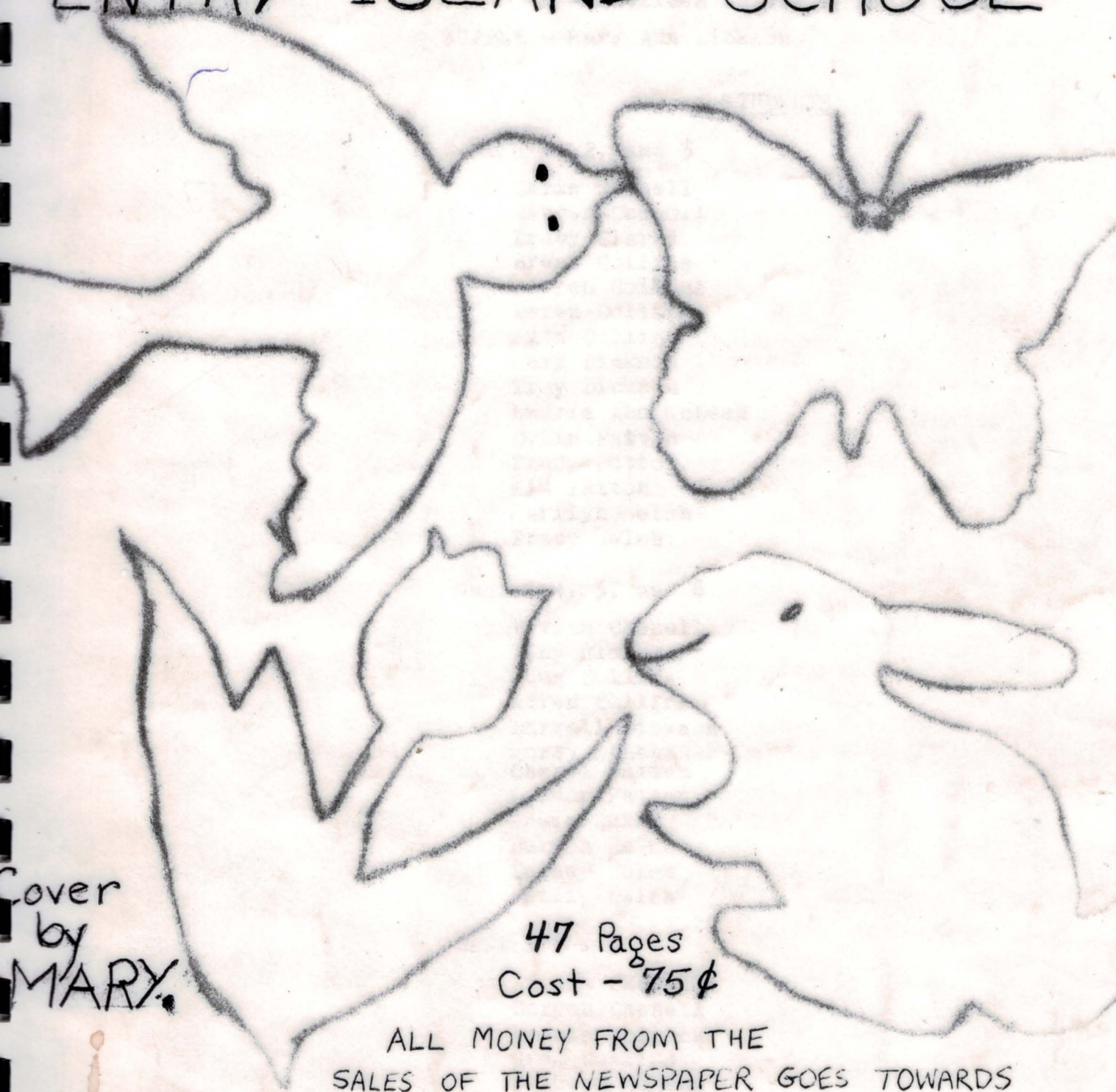

## \* 1976-77 School Year News \*

September 6<sup>th</sup> saw the doors of Entry Island School officially opened for the students to start their school year 1976-77. Although it was the first day for them, the staff for this year, comprised of Mrs. Josey, Miss Nelson, Mr. Cumming and Mr. Griffiths, had been in the school for some time already, getting the place set up to start off the new year in the best way possible.

An assembly of the students on the first day set the tone for the rest of the year. They were told at the beginning what was expected of them and what they could look forward to.

The month of September was a busy one for all.

For the first two weeks of October, the school was closed due to a province wide strike over working conditions. The strike was settled around the middle of the month and the teachers won the right to have their workload reduced to the same as what the French majority who were getting the same salary. Due to the small number of teachers here, the Entry Island staff does not have the same benefits as teachers elsewhere and have to spend more time in the classroom.

The school was not empty during those two weeks, though. The new windows were put in, which was a very big job. The sills all had to be taken out and then replaced after the new frames had been fitted. At the same time, the entire lighting system was replaced with new florescent lights which give off a much better light and are very efficient so that they use much less electricity than the old lightbulbs did.

Shortly after our return to classes in October we received our new curtains for all the classrooms,

the gym, and the old residence part.

The living room part of the residence has now been made over into an attractive library with quality magazines such as National Geographic, Arctic in Colour, Macleans, The Imperial Oil Review, Unesco Courier, Time etc. There is an assortment of newspapers such as The Montreal Star, Spec, Home and School News, and Radar. There are new book displays, a special section on Magdalen Island material and student artwork.

We have just recently had the good fortune of receiving a grant of 200 new books from the Canada Council. This is largely the result of the efforts of Mr. Cumming who successfully applied for one of these rare and hard to get grants. These new books will be gradually be put on our shelves throughout the summer and the next school year.

The library is open to the students during school hours and open to adults every Tuesday evening from 6 until 7 p.m. and will be open during the summer for the entire community at the regular Tuesday evening time starting July 19<sup>th</sup>.

At the end of October an afternoon was set aside for a Halloween party for the students and several contests, events, and games were enjoyed. A lunch was prepared by some of the women of the island who volunteered to help. The school is always grateful for such input and assistance from the community.

A "homework hour" was held every Tuesday and Thursday night during the winter, for the students to come and do their work at the school in the evenings. This was in operation for most of the year and was discontinued shortly before Easter when attendance fell off as the good weather approached.

The School Committee this year was made up of Marie Collins, Cathy Welsh, Nettie Welsh, Wanda Collins and Mavis (Midge) Patton. They have helped a lot through the year, keeping the school informed about school-community relations and expressing their concerns. We are thankful for their response to our requests for information during the planning of various events and assistance in carrying them out.

Some of the first dances of the year were held before Christmas. The students were able to come up with a parent chaperone to accompany the teacher representative at the dance. As the school year went on however, they have not been as successful and have had fewer. We have tried to ensure that the same parents were not doing it all the time, to make it more equitable. A special thanks must be made to Marie Collins and Marg Welsh who have been present more than once to do their duty for the students.

The students are not allowed to have a dance if they can't get one parent to chaperone. This is to ensure that parents get involved and is ~~a~~ a way of showing that they care about the social development of their children.

The Christmas season was topped off with a Christmas Concert which was very well attended despite the horrible slush, snow, and rain storm which made travel very difficult. Santa Claus was there to hand out the presents to the youngsters and even managed to get a few kisses on the cheek thrown in to the bargain.

Everybody went home to spend the holidays with their families.

Upon their return in January, both students

and teachers started working hard again in their 2<sup>nd</sup> school term. In early February for 2 weeks, we had two student teachers visit us from Bishop's University in Lennoxville, Quebec. Miss Debbie Lawton did some teaching in grades 1 to 3 and Miss Joanne Endacott worked with grades 4 to 6.

On February 10 and 11 we had a Winter Carnival which saw the 3 HOUSES of the school compete for the chance to have their Prince and Princess become the King and Queen of the Carnival. Following a talent show on the Friday night, that honor went to Cheryl Patton and Greg Collins who represented Green House. They led off the Carnival Dance. There was a very good turnout for all the Carnival events.

March passed by quickly and soon it was April, which started off with the Easter Holidays and fairly flew by too. May came before we knew it.

Throughout these months, music lessons were given after school to a number of students who learned how to play the recorder, the ukulele, and these lessons are still going on.

The sports program was also in operation throughout the greater part of the year and some of them were Boarding Ball, Floor Hockey, Broomball, Soccer and now Softball. Each sport ran a full schedule of games with all of the students being able to participate on a house basis.

The plans for the rest of the year are just as exciting. A trip on the Lucy Maud is planned for May 25<sup>th</sup> for the senior students. The junior ones

will be going on a different day to Amherst, the Sea Museum, and other points of interest there.

June 4<sup>th</sup> is the date planned for a mixed softball tournament here against Grosse Isle School for students in grades 4 to 8. The opposition will be arriving on the "local" and will be having a quick lunch at the school around meal time before going on to the morning activities.

June 17<sup>th</sup> is the day we hope to have a Track and Field competition for the school, although that is not finalized.

June 21<sup>st</sup> is the last day of school for this year and reports will go out on that day. Weather permitting, there will be a bonfire that evening to celebrate the end of the year.

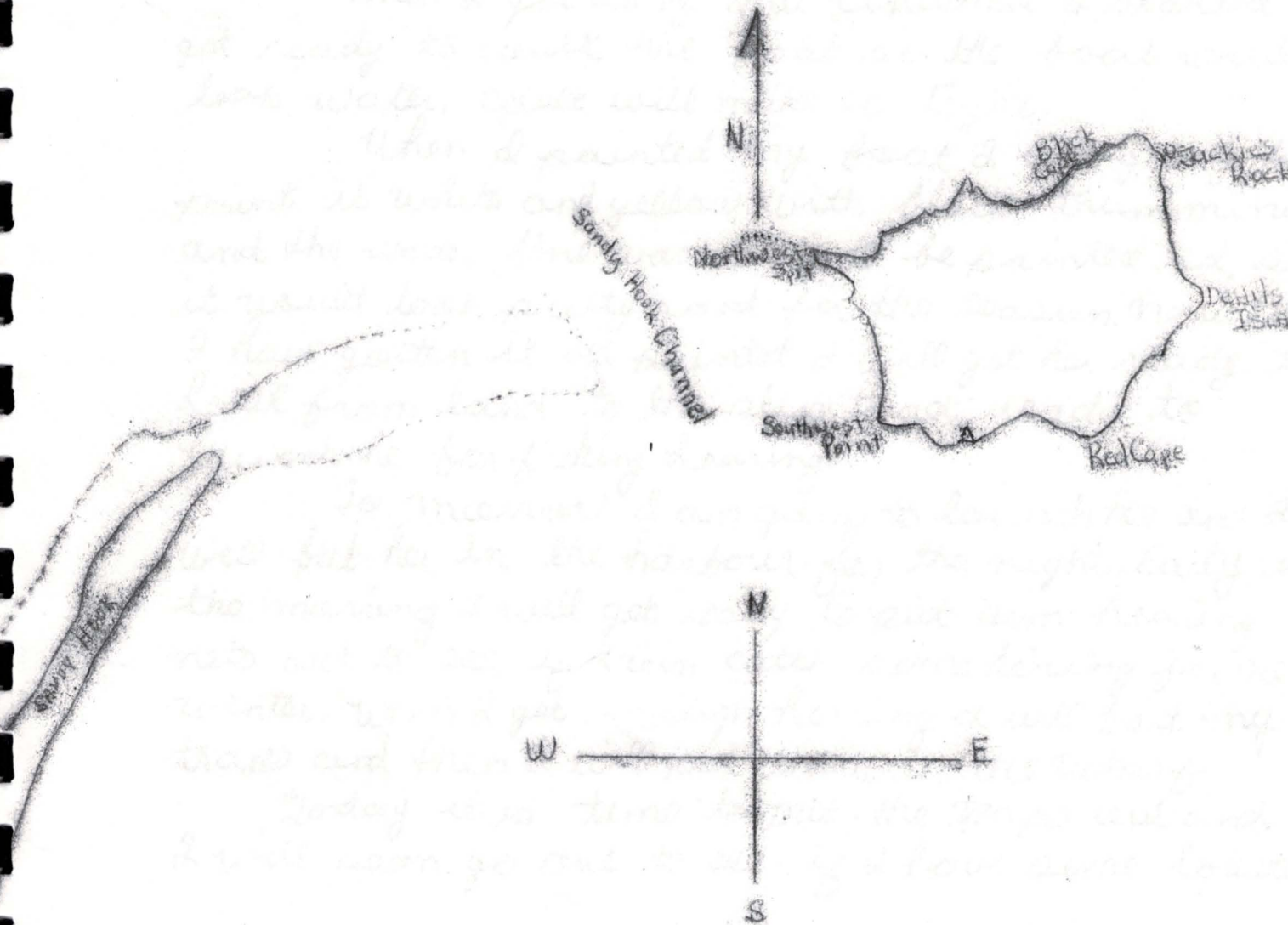
Apart from all these activities that have happened and those which are planned for the remainder of the year, the students have been required to keep up their school work and many of them have had to stay in from time to time to get their work done which wasn't properly supervised at home. Homework is always explained before the student goes home and he is never assigned new work, so there is really no excuse for not having it done. That is primarily the student's responsibility and that of the parents to see that they do it. It must be done to ensure steady progress.

I close by saying that all indications show that this has been a very successful and

rewarding year for the students of Entry Island School and we hope that they have an enjoyable summer.

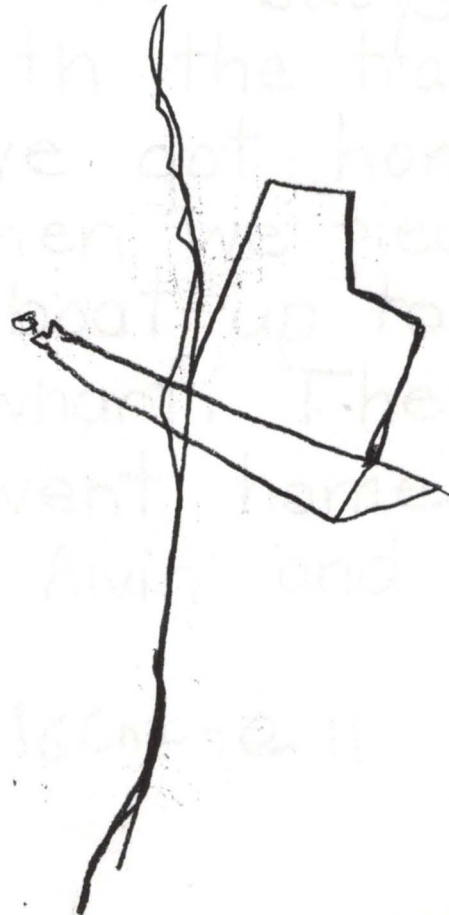
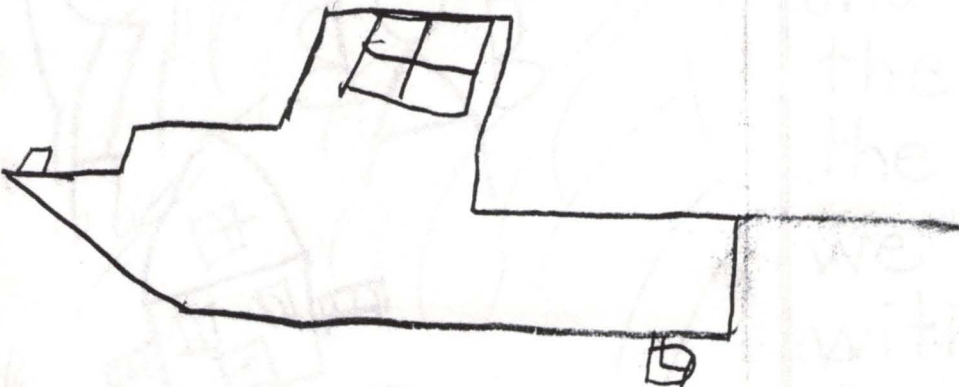
## THE FIRST DAY OF FISHING

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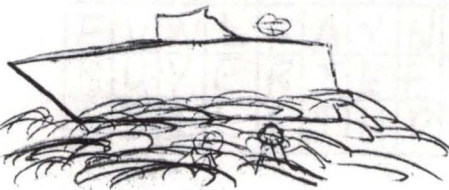

## TRIP TO SOURIS

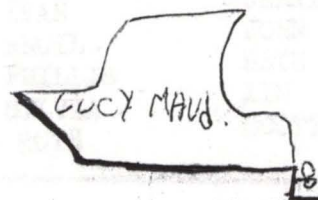

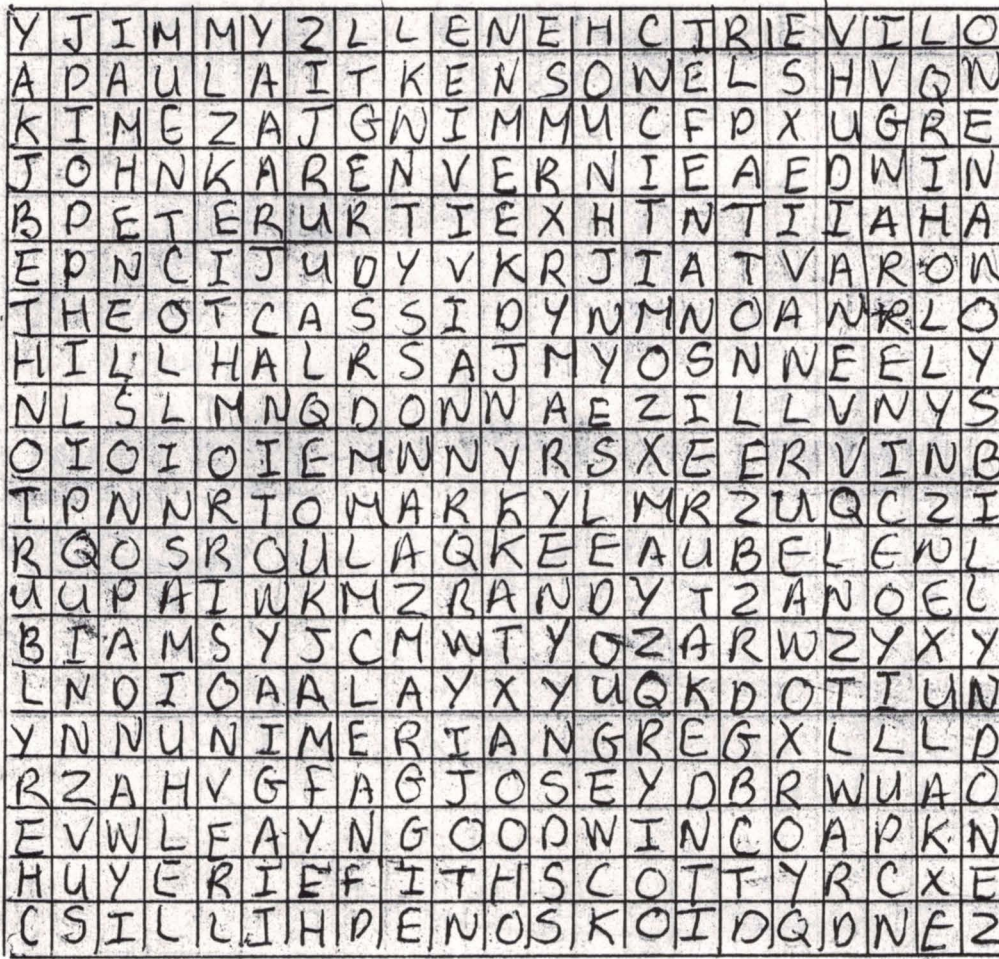

If you have not been around the Cabot Trail I would be nice to go and I hope you will enjoy it as much as I did.

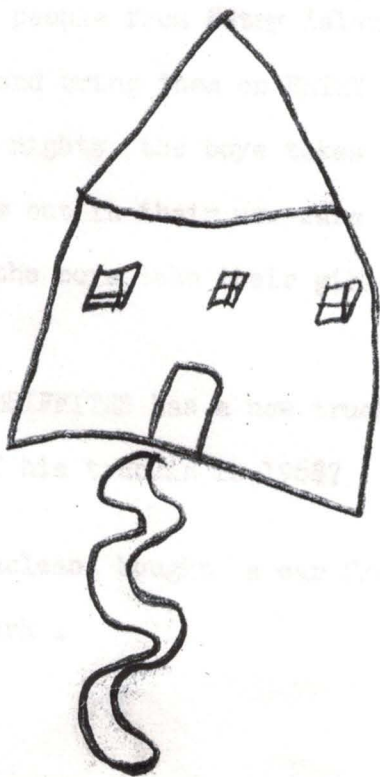
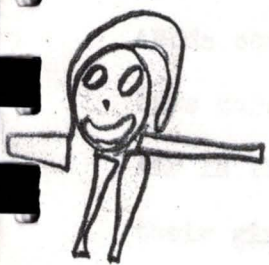

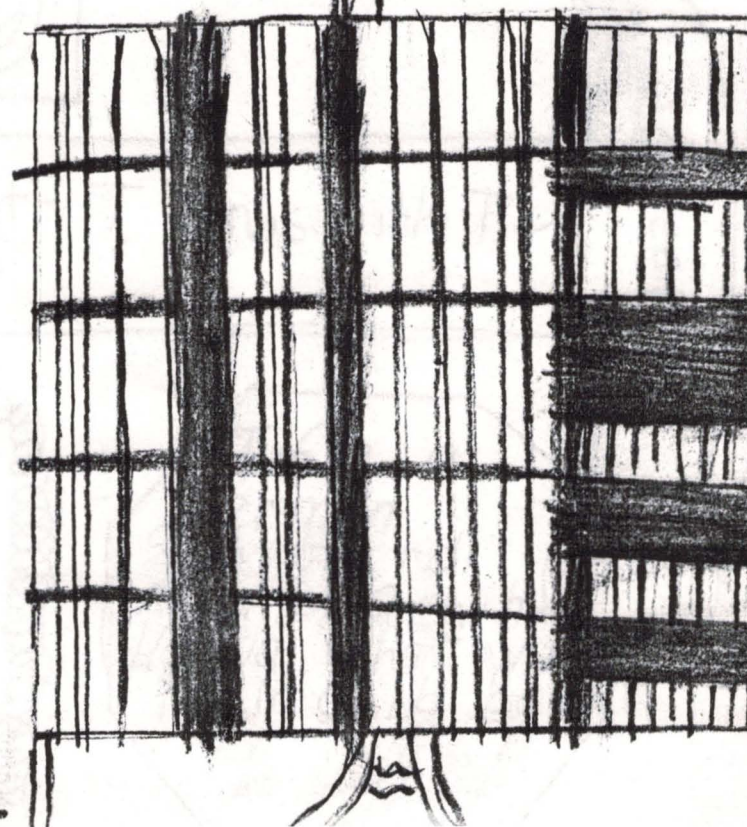
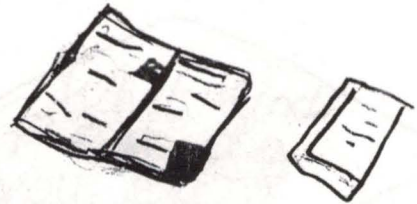
LIBRARY IN THE SUMMER

## The Church

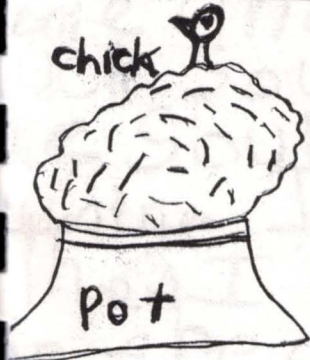


I suppose everyone knows about the church half-burning down but I am going to write about it anyhow.

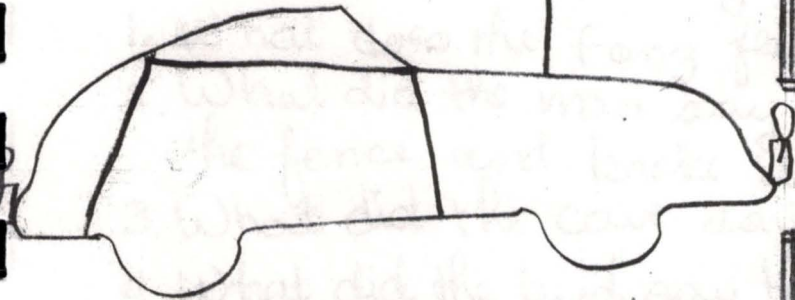
## An Awful Cake
