A word from Pauline



25 years working to make a difference within my community

I am unsure of how 25 years has passed by so quickly. I began this organization as a community member wanting to bring people together who shared my passion for organizing and creating events, activities that did not exist within the English-speaking community and was available to all community members.

In 1999 the conversation began with the CLSC and NFSB as partners. In 2004 we received our charter and in 2005 we had our first New Horizon Grant for \$16,000.00 to have computer classes for Seniors at St-Willibrord school, thanks to the then Principal Bonnie Mitchell who also had a heart for lifelong learning and including community within the school.

In 2007 along came Chuck Halliday and a new partnership was created that would take us both to new heights and many new developments that would improve the life of students, teachers and intergenerational activities. We were then known as the Chateauguay English Community Network (CECN). In 2015 I was getting a little restless and was concerned that because this organization was not government funded, it was not sustainable. I thought about expanding the region from Chateauguay to include the whole Montérégie West. So, in 2016 the name was changed to the Montérégie West Community Network. Soon after we began to have conversations with funders in Health and Social Services who gave us some small grants to support English-speaking seniors. In 2018 we became fully recognized as the official representatives of the English-speaking community in Roussillon, Les Jardins-de-Napierville, Haut-St-Laurent (Chateauguay Valley), Beauharnois/Salaberry and Vaudreuil-Soulanges. This is a population of over 100,150 thousand English-speakers. In 2021 we received funding from the Provincial Government, Le secretariat des Quebecois d'expression anglaises. Our work is diverse and includes all ages. We have programs in Employability, Health and Social Services, Early childhood Education, Our Youth, Mental Health, Legal Workshops, Lunch and Learns, French conversation and much more. Our staff of 15 throughout our 5 offices are there to serve you, to support you and to include you in all our activities. Our many, many volunteers are eager helpers and make us strong and connected. We value all of you and we know that volunteers are the backbone of our community.

In conclusion I would like to thank all who have journeyed with me these last 25 years, the ups and the downs, the tears, frustrations have been the foundation of who we are today.Thank you to my family who have always been supportive, thank you to my wonderful team whom I am so honoured to work with. Now lets work together with a vision to include all, especially our most vulnerable community members.

In 2004, the group became The Chateauguay English Community Network (Le Reseau Anglophone de la Communauté de Chateauguay) The "CECN". Since May, 2016, we have been known as the Montérégie West Community Network; the MWCN! MWCN is a non-profit organization with a mandate to build a strong and dynamic English-speaking community working closely with our francophone partners and our Native American neighbors.

For the event to be successful we formed a committee who worked for several months to make sure every aspect of the event was covered.
