PREVENTION IN CONNECTION WITH FINANCIAL ABUSE

Phishing

An institution or organization asks you to provide your personal information to validate your account.

Trust your instincts and don't click on the links in the email. Banks and government agencies do not send email or text messages to reach you.

Dating Sites

Someone asks you for personal information or to send them money for their family.

Do not send money and never send your banking information to these sites. Despite the flattering appearance of a profile, it is unclear who is behind the screen.

Emergencies

You receive a call or email indicating that someone close to you is in distress and you need to send money immediately.

Ask questions. Ask your loved ones. Do not give out personal information.

HELPFUL TIPS



Do not keep large amounts of cash in your home. Keep your credit limit as low as possible.



Use direct deposit rather than cheques. Ex: pension cheques

Carefully monitor your account transactions from a bank statement.





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What's Cooking?

California Date Squares

34 cup dates

1 tsp soda

1 cup boiling water

Allow to cool and add:

3 tbsp butter, 1 cup sugar, and 1 tsp vanilla

Sift together: 1 ¾ cups flour, ½ tsp baking powder, ½ tsp salt

Add to above mixture and bake 350 F for 40 minutes.

Top with the following mixture:

6 tbsp butter

½ cup brown sugar

4 tbsp can milk

1 cup coconut

Return to oven and bake for 10 minutes or until golden brown.
