# **PROJECTS FOR SENIORS:**

### **WELLNESS CENTRES:**

The objective of the Wellness Centres is to help seniors live independently

- We achieve this by providing participants with health information and activities that maintain and improve the physical, mental, emotional, and psychological states of participants
- The Wellness Centres focus on crafts, games, and information sharing
- An average of 15-20 seniors attended the bi-weekly Barachois Wellness Centre

- The Douglastown Wellness Centre had an average of 6 participants
- It began in October 2023, a new location, and occurred monthly
- Topics presented included Diabetes and Nutrition, Community Herbalism, and Resilience and popular workshops were Cricut machine use, a spring craft, and infusing essential oils

- The Gaspé Wellness Centre enjoyed a number of workshops and activities, some examples include:

- Activities like a museum visit, pizza lunches, games, variations of Pictionary, darts, trivia, chair dance and yoga workouts, word games, a Christmas bingo, and line dancing were enjoyed by all

# CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES:

### **CHILDREN**

Wiggle, Rhyme, & Storytime

- An activity for children 0-8 years old, alternating between Gaspé and Barachois once a month
- A book is read to the children, a snack and a craft are provided
- 4-6 children participate on average
- Part of the Bright Beginnings programming

### Fierce & Proud

- This project is designed to teach life skills to children 8-12
- Sessions take place at Gaspé Elementary School and Belle Anse Elementary School every week, alternating between schools
- A few of the skills learned by the children are the basics of sewing and cooking, how to do laundry, and more
- Approximately 35 children from Gaspé Elementary School and 13 children from Belle Anse Elementary School participated
- Part of the Bright Beginnings programming

### YOUTH

### Vue d'ensemble

- A 2-year project to develop bilingual activities that facilitate interactions between English and French youth
- A weekly drama class was held, where students read and acted out scripts and stories, learned about costumes, sang, and more
- Average attendance was between 4-6 students
- Once a week, we used the art room during lunch hour for crafting. Various crafts were offered, such as, holiday themes, lanterns, card and ornament making, bookmarks, canvas art, diamond painting, destination arrow painting, gnomes, beach jars, and so on
- These activities were well attended, with anywhere from 6-17 students
- A few trivia game days and a Waldo selfie challenge were offered during lunch hour
- PS5 access was offered once a month and attended primarily by male students, with an average attendance of 8 students
- Other monthly activities included karaoke/dance nights, glow party, Christmas ornament making, bingo, and laser tag

#### Youth Mental Health Initiative

- Vision presented youth mental health priorities at key committee meetings, consultations, and throughout the network
- Vision and CASA collaborated on developing a Discord server for youth in the Gaspésie, currently in beta-testing
- Secondary 4 and 5 students at the Gaspé Polyvalent School completed the Strengths Finder program
- Students worked through a series of workshops uncovering and learning about their natural talents that can be used to succeed in their future schooling or personal endeavors

With Resource Manager Amie Chicoine

- Vision enlisted the services of Horizon: Service de santé en plein air, a team of mental health professionals to offer the following services
- Students enrolled in WOTP (Work Orientation Training Program) at the Gaspé Polyvalent School participated in a series of workshops designed to address issues relating to self-esteem, self-awareness, confidence, social anxiety, and other challenges identified on an individual basis
- The Secondary 4 boys took part in a series of survival workshops aimed at developing communication skills to facilitate teamwork
- Students at the local CEGEP enjoyed a workshop on ecoanxiety held during Humanity and Society Week
- Horizon Plein Air prepared an activity survey for Vision to present during the CEGEP's orientation day
- Youth enjoyed an evening of "Mocktails and Glam" with local wellness coach Gabrielle Hélène Coulter prior to exams and the holiday season
- A group of youth attended a Screen addiction Kahoot with Aire Ouverte at Vision's Barachois location
- Youth helped celebrate Vision's 20th anniversary at the "Party like it's 2004" event with local DJ Nitro

### **FAMILIES**

### Focus groups

- Partnership with the elementary school administration to plan/host focus groups for existing and future caregivers of children, concerning the potential to increase the French second language programming at an English elementary school
- 3 consultation meetings were held and 25 parents participated

### MENTAL WELLNESS


- Funded by the CHSSN
- Information sessions and workshops were offered in collaboration with Regroupement des Femmes, Nouveau Regard, and Horizon Plein Aire
- Wellness activities included walks, chocolate making activities, board game nights, journaling/scrapbooking activities, and various activities aimed specifically at women's wellness
- The chocolate activities were popular and usually attended by 15-18 people
- Invited Alter-Heroes to talk to high school students and staff about acceptance regarding neurodiversity and the 2SLGBTQIA+ community
- A similar discussion animated by Alter-Heroes was held with the public at the Douglastown Community Centre.

# **FROZEN MEALS**

Vision's Frozen Meals Program continues to grow. This year saw a 31% increase in the number of seniors served – 929 seniors. Due to increased production capacity we saw a 33% increase in the number of meals sold – 13,164 meals. A huge thank you to our partners and everyone who works hard to make this program so successful! We are proud to provide this service to the seniors of our community.


