

Alliance Quebec queries quibblers from the Office de la langue française

Alliance Quebec invited the media to Mr. Nelruckers Diner to learn about the punctilious punctuation policies of the *Office de la langue française*. Reporters also learned of the assault of the awful air conditioning sign, the naughty newsletter's blatant bilingualism and other inspiring indications of our Quebec tax dollars at work.
