SAQ 2023-2024 AGM

Our Annual General Meeting was held on Wednesday, June 19, 2024. As Montreal was in the throes of a heatwave, we had to do a last-minute pivot. Instead of having a full day event off-site, as originally planned, we decided to hold the morning event as scheduled and the afternoon AGM over Zoom. We were very pleased to see that despite the heat, several brave souls decided to show up at the Multifaith Chapel on the Loyola Campus of Concordia University for the screening (a great success) of our short documentary on seniors' sense of <u>belonging to Quebec</u>.

This was our final project in the <u>COM-Unity project</u> that ran from 2020–2023. It was the first time Seniors Action Quebec had screened the documentary before an audience and it was a long overdue premiere! After enjoying an animated question and answer period, people continued discussing what they had just seen or caught up with other attendees before collecting their lunch boxes and going home to shelter in the coolness of air conditioned rooms. MEETING WITH MINISTER OF FRENCH-LANGUAGE

On August 12, we received an invitation to attend a meeting with the Minister for the French language, Jean-François Roberge, concerning the Government of Quebec's newest health directive. As an organization representing the interests of English-speaking seniors, we felt it was necessary to be in attendance to relay the concerns being expressed by seniors and their ability to continue accessing health and social services in English and also to support our colleagues at the <u>Cummings Centre</u> and <u>Jeffrey Hale</u> who were also in attendance.

At the meeting, we shared our deep concern with the confusion this directive has created within the English-speaking community and impacted institutions. We also expressed our uneasiness and hope that a larger contingent of stakeholders from across the English-speaking, and cultural communities could meet with Ministers in the future and share their concerns.

Seniors Action Quebec is encouraged that the provincial government expressed a willingness to discuss the numerous concerns we raised regarding this health directive. An updated version of the directives were published on September 23 2024 and can be viewed here (please note, directives are only available in French) A checklist version of the directives is available in English. HOUSING REPORT

During the 2023-2024 fiscal year, Seniors Action Quebec carried out research into the housing situation in Quebec and its effect particularly on English-speaking seniors. This research involved the production of eight webinars explaining the complex and growing concerns with housing. These webinars (which can all be found on the <u>SAQ YouTube page</u>) met with great success.

After extracting all the salient information submitted in these webinars, over the summer we prepared a report which will shortly be shared on our website in both English and French. We will keep you informed of developments.

ONE VOICE COALITION

Most of 2023-2024 was spent on meeting with each individual organization that sits on the Coalition and working with them on a needs assessment survey and deciding on the next steps to moving the group forward collectively.
