Since 2015 REISA has been working to increase and improve access to services for the English-Speaking community with Special Needs in the East End of Montreal. In March 2017 REISA

hosted a forum on access to services for persons with special needs. Community organizations, public institutions, caregivers and experts in the field were present to discuss the new Action Plan on MSSS Autism Spectrum Disorder.

As a follow up to the forum, a proposal of a multidisciplinary clinic for special needs services was presented to the CIUSSS de l'Est-de-l'Île-de-Montréal and the CIUSSS du Nord-de-l'Île-de-Montréal.

As a result, both the CIUSSS du Nordde-l'Île-de-Montréal and the CIUSSS de l'Est-de-l'Île-de-Montréal have agreed to collaborate with REISA and the Centre of Dreams and Hopes. Clientele of the

Centre of Dreams and Hopes will now be able to make an appointment with a Doctor to be seen directly at the center where they feel most comfortable. 13 clinics in adopted as innovative the east end have also agreed to reserve time each day where clientele with special

> needs and reduced mobility can call and make appointments to reduce time spent in waiting rooms. This initiative will improve access by providing direct primary health care services to people with special needs within calm, comforting environment, adapted through years of direct support to families.

Your Mental Health, Your Life Fulfillment.

This spring REISA partnered with Laurier Macdonald high school to plan a two-day Mental Health fair for 6 participating East end high schools. The goal of the fair was to educate participants on English services available in the East-end that could be easily accessed by youth and their families. Participants of the Mental Health Fair on October 2nd and 3rd included over 12 Montreal community organizations, the English Montreal School Board, and representatives of 2 CIUSSS. The fair was a great success with over 1,200 youth, school staff, and parents in attendance. Many partnerships have flourished the fair and we look forward to new collaborations! REISA would like to sincerely thank the CIUSSS de l'Est-de-l'Île-de-Montréal and the CIUSSS du Nord-de-l'Île-de-Montréal for their active participation over the two days. We would also like to extend a big thank you to all participating community organizations, the English Montreal School Board, and of course, Laurier Macdonald High School!
