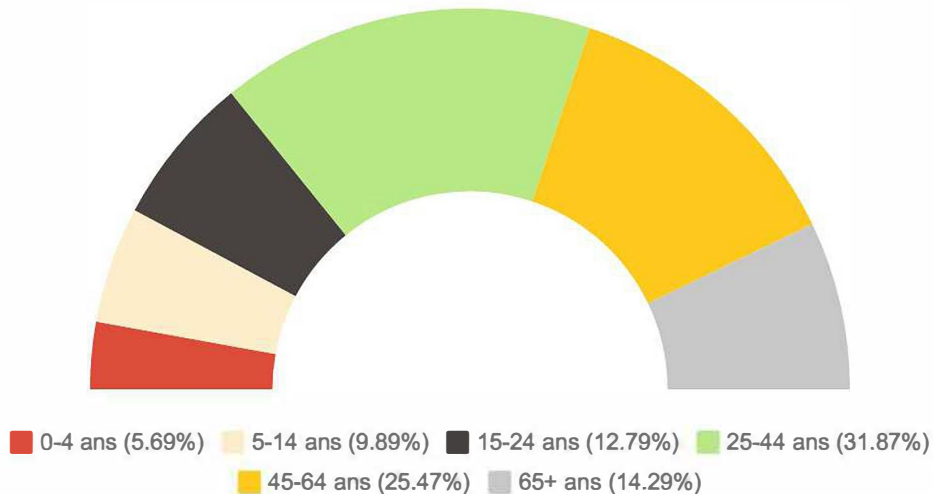

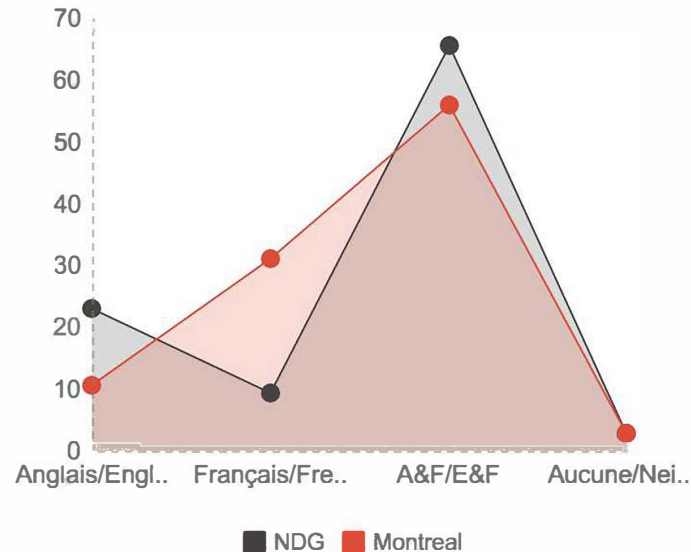
UNE COMMUNAUTÉ MULTILINGUE MULTILINGUAL COMMUNITY

- 65.4% speak French and English compared to 55.8% in Montreal

- 65,4% parlent français et anglais comparé à 55,8% pour Montréal

- 70+ languages spoken

- Plus de 70 langues parlées

NDG IS DIVERSE

- La population des membres d'une minorité visible a connu une explosion (24,8 % en 5 ans)

- Immigration plus diffuse sur le territoire, très concentrée dans certains secteurs (Walkley, Saint-Raymond, WestHaven)

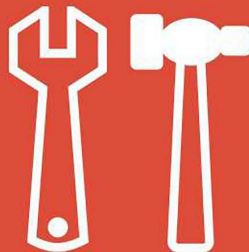


LOGEMENT - HOUSING



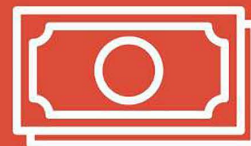
Higher rates of renter households: 65% of renter households compared to 61% in Montreal

Taux plus élevé de ménages locataires: 65% sont locataires comparé à 61% pour Montréal



13% of housing units in the territory require major repairs compared to 9% in Montreal

13% des logements sur le territoire exigent des réparations majeures comparé à 9% pour Montréal



44% of renters dedicate a high percentage of their income (30% or more) to rent, compared to 41% for the Island of Montreal

44% des locataires consacrent une part importante de leur revenu (30% ou plus) au loyer, comparé à 41% pour l'île de Montréal

NDG IS ACTIVE!



90 musical acts by 180 local artists (mostly from NDG) performed at Porchfest 2016

10,000+ people reached through NDG Arts Week annually

12+ active tables on community issues

New Benny Library and Cultural Centre

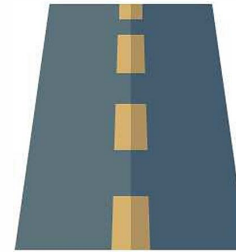
10+ community groups and organizations looking for affordable space

Some organizations have closed including: MUCS, BCA, Black Star

Many organizations are struggling to pay staff a living wage

SAFETY & SECURITY

- Aller-retour program offered by STN 11 police ensures an unsolicited visit to a home within a month after a potential domestic violence incident
- Senior women report that they do not walk alone at night, especially in the winter.
- There are 8 approx. street workers in NDG, including a new one for seniors.
- Racial profiling is an issue in NDG, as it is across Quebec.



ECONOMY



27% of NDGers are low income. The rates are higher in Westhaven, Benny Farm, Walkley and Saint-Raymond where the demographic weight of young people is higher.



NDG has the highest number of people who identify as 'working poor' in the health field, across all of Montreal (5.6% of pop)



High number of empty storefronts (especially ground-floor of condo buildings).

WORKING POOR

29% increase in working poor from 2006 to 2012 for CDN-NDG (from 7,100 to 9,170 people)

Immigrants who have been in Canada less than 10 years make up 1/3 of working poor.

50% of working poor in CDN-NDG have children

Sales and services and manufacturing are the most common sectors.

Most working poor in CDN-NDG live in St-Raymond, Westhaven, Walkley (north end in particular), Snowden and the strip along Decarie.



EDUCATION

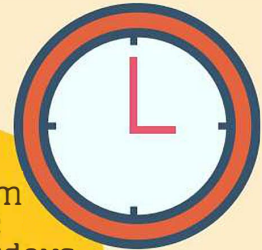

HEALTH AND WELLBEING



NDG has at least 4 low-income sectors and 3 food deserts



Benny Farm CLSC clinic open weekdays only, no weekend or evening hours.



Local community centres offer free sports, rec & after school programming



Last year 642 youth accessed Head and Hands' medical clinic, 103 without healthcare.

ENVIRONMENT



NDGers are the most vocal about trees at borough council and 311 compared to other boroughs.

NDG also has the best tree canopy in Montreal (reduces heat islands)

7 green alleys are in progress

New reserved bus line on Sherbrooke (#105)

There are fewer Communauto vehicles in NDG than most other boroughs

STM Seniors shuttle pilot cancelled in NDG

The Falaise St. Jacques and Dalle Park project needs provincial support
