COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Research Requests

This fiscal year, QUESCREN responded to **21 research requests** from stakeholders on a range of topics related to English-speaking Quebec, including evaluating projects and services related to the English-speaking community; youth mental health and literacy; and decision-making in schools.

Bibliography on English-speaking Quebec

This **bibliography**, which Brendan O'Donnell has been compiling since the 1970s, contains secondary sources related to the study of English-speaking Quebec. Resources include everything from scholarly studies to magazine articles, by way of films and websites. This year Brendan added 326 titles to the bibliography, bringing the total number of entries up to 14,284. This invaluable resource was searched 25,712 times by 21,974 unique visitors. Thanks to Brendan for his decades of volunteer work on this!

Community Knowledge Open Library (CKOL)

The **Community Knowledge Open Library (CKOL)** is a growing online fulltext database listing of grey literature sourced from the province's Englishspeaking community groups. Grey literature is unpublished but non-archival material made available to the public, such as annual reports, research reports, lectures, PowerPoints, newsletters, and pamphlets. So far, 42 community partner organizations and individuals from across Quebec have joined the project. We had three cataloguers working on this in 2022-2023, and we catalogued a total of 3,663 resources, up from 1,530 the year before. Knowledge of this relatively new resource is growing, with 1,595 unique visitors in the past year, up from 471 the previous year. In addition to our core funding, a grant from **Health Canada**, supported by **Dialogue McGill at McGill University**, allowed us to add hundreds of new resources related to health and social services.

COM-Unity


The COM-Unity initiative brings together seven partner organizations from the arts, culture, heritage, and education sectors, whose individual projects aim to explore, celebrate, and **share the stories that reflect English-speaking communities and build a strong sense of identification with Quebec.** QUESCREN manages the project and its Community of Practice. The partners are: the Black Community Resource Centre, Blue Metropolis, the English Language Arts Network, the Leading English Education and Resource Network (LEARN), the Quebec Anglophone Heritage Network, Seniors Action Quebec, and Y4Y Quebec. The Secrétariat aux relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise funds this project.



ILET Research Hub

The ILET Impact pilot project involves collaborating with the Inter-Level Educational Table (ILET) to **create a website** addressing knowledge gaps on English-language education in Quebec. The website will include films, **podcasts, infographics, and other resources** related to research priorities identified by the Table. In 2022-2023, three short films were recorded along with a podcast. The website will be launched later in 2023. The Department of Canadian Heritage finances this project.
